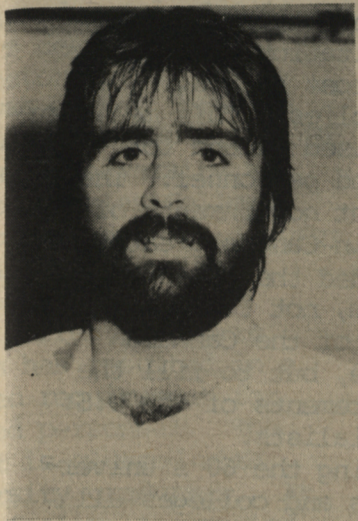


# PANTHER NAMED TO All-Canadian TEAM

recent weeks in capturing high honors. The Panthers senior defenceman has been selected as a unanimous ALL-CANADIAN.

Although rumors had been around, confirmation was received today that Wilfred had indeed been selected to the team. In addition, he was runner-up in the balloting for the Sullivan award, emblematic of the nation's top college hockey player.

For MacDonald it is another in a long list of achievements that have been accomplished since his arrival four years ago. During the course of his

career he was named tournament all-star once, rookie of the year, most valuable player, all-conference three times, Ponderosa Cup champion three times, athlete of the month twice, Athlete of the year as well as league M.V.P.

It has been a career that has seen him perform at a level that has been unparalleled thus far in UPEI hockey history. He has been the cornerstone of the program, playing almost 50 minutes a game throughout his career. He has never missed a game and holds or shares several

team records.

His selection as ALL-CANADIAN comes as a great tribute to his play this year. Coming down the stretch he was a dominant force and led the team in scoring for the last seven regular season games and the three playoff games.

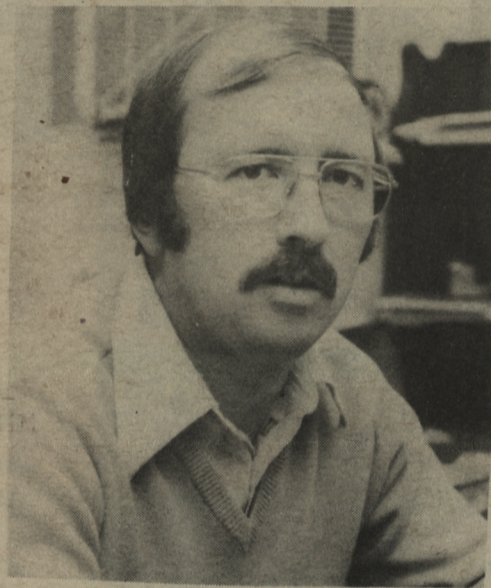


## ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM

The national final is scheduled for Sunday afternoon on CBC beginning at 3:00 p.m. It is understood that there will be filmed highlights of the presentations as well as film clips of all the ALL-CANADIANS.
