### SENIOR CLASS REPORT

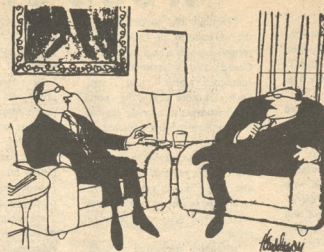
The first Senior Class meeting of 1986-87 was held last Wednesday, September 10 in the Panther Lounge. Turnout was fair but more support is definitely needed.
