For the honeymoon the bride travelled in a navy wool suit with white accessories and corage of candy striped carnations.

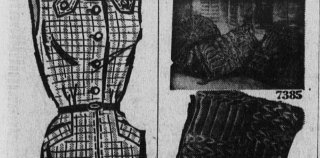
