## CURRENCIES

**MONTREAL** (CP)—The U.S. dollar Monday closed at a discount of 1 1/2-3/4 per cent in terms of Canadian funds, up 3/4-1/2. Pound sterling \$2.77 5/16, up 1/2.

## TORONTO

**TORONTO** (CP)—Uranium led the stock market to higher ground amid moderate trading Monday. A rally during the final half hour pulled prices up to their highs for the day.

Golds added more than three-quarters of a point to their index while base metals and western oils had smaller index gains.

The market opened with an upward spurt but cautious trading took over after the first hour and continued until the final 30 minutes when key uranium, spurred by the weekend announcement that Canada is to sell \$105,000,000 worth of uranium to Britain after 1962, moved up in a solid line.

Brokers said the uncertainty was caused by the announcement Saturday that Canada is to have a Federal election March 31. They said the caution which usually prevails before an election will probably continue for some weeks.

Most high-priced uranium were fractionally higher at the close while several low-priced stocks added as much as 15 cents. Senior base metals, golds and high-priced western oils gained major fractions. Junior stocks in these sections generally had more gains than losses but changes were small.

Index gains: golds .84 to 76.48; base metals .65 to 149.73; western oils .81 to 134.36.
