LONGSHOREMEN OF MONTREAL

To Meet Sunday, With Trouble Brewing, Hat and Cap Strike Now On.

MONTREAL, May 4--(Special)--A Mass meeting of the longshoremen of Montreal is to be held on Sunday next. This action is ascribed to the feeling of unrest which is said to have developed recently.

THE METHODIST CONFERENCE PLANS

Meeting at Fredericton to Arrange Plans, Rev. W. W. Lodge President.

FREDERICTON, May 3--The committees appointed to make arrangements for the New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island Methodist conference, which will meet at Marysville commencing on June 21st, held their first meeting Tuesday, at the residence of Marysville, those present being Rev. W. W. Lodge, president of the conference; Rev. Mr. Young, of St. Stephen, the secretary; Rev. W. B. Thomas, pastor of Marysville Methodist church, and Rev. James Crisp, chairman of the Fredericton district. Rev. Dr. Rogers, a member of the committee, was unable to attend owing to illness.

NEW BRUNSWICK JUDICATURE ACT

To Be Made Effective and Judges Retired--Baptist Church Extends Call--Important Decision as to Sale of Liquors to be Sold in Scott Act Counties.

St. JOHN, May 4--(Special)--It is understood the Ottawa Government intends introducing a Bill giving effect to the Judicature Act passed at last session of the New Brunswick Legislature. It will make compulsory the retirement of Judges who have reached the age limit.

RUSSIA HAS PUT FRANCE TO A TEST

Demand For Extradition of Poet . . . Russia As Ally Wants France to Give Up Author of Blasphemous Verse . . . Puts France in a Most Embarrassing Position.

PARIS, May 3--Holy Russia has succeeded at last in putting unorthodox France in a most embarrassing position by demanding the extradition of a fugitive subject against whom there is a charge of blasphemy--Amfitatroff, a revolutionary novelist and journalist.

YESTERDAY WAS QUIET AT OTTAWA

Montreal Harbor Affairs and Agriculture Estimates Dealt With.

OTTAWA, May 4--(Special)--The Commons today discussed Montreal harbor affairs and the Bill incorporating the new Harbor Commission was given its third reading.

BLUEBERRIES MUST BE FREE

OTTAWA, May 3--The House of Commons this afternoon went into committee on the fruit marks act. There was a long discussion on a proposition by Plebe, of Montreal, extending to wild berries the clause requiring goods to be up to a certain standard.

SUBMARINE AND TUG COLLIDED

NEWPORT, R. I., May 3--The Government tug Mina was rammed yesterday by the submarine torpedo boat Popoos during the manoeuvres in Oodington Cove, and the tug was forced to run full speed for the shore to escape sinking.

JEAN SARRIEN FRENCH PREMIER

PARIS, May 3--With regard to the French Premier, Jean Sarrien, the ribbon of the Legion of Honor which he wears in his buttonhole was won by him for gallantry under the fire as captain of mobiles in the war of 1870. He is one of the most eminent and statesmanlike men in France.

WAR IS DECLARED ON STANDARD OIL

Bureau of Corporations Presents Strong Report and President Roosevelt a Strenuous Message Against Its Unlawful Rebates and Absolute Monopoly--Officers Make Denial.

WASHINGTON, May 4--(Special)--The report of the Bureau of Corporations, which has been investigating the Standard Oil methods was presented to Congress today together with a strong message from President Roosevelt condemning the Company and recommending reform legislation.

OTTAWA, May 3--In the Senate today Hon. Mr. Ferguson brought up the question of communication between Prince Edward Island and the mainland. The people on the island had been led to believe that a vote of \$175,000, passed last session was to be spent in extending a new and more powerful ice-breaking steamer to be placed on the Northumberland in winter by November 1906 and to have a horsepower of not less than 3,000.
