Co-op Congress Is Talk Theme

SUMMERSIDE — Reid Sangster was the guest speaker of the Summerside Co-op Junior Board of Directors annual meeting held at the Dept. of Agriculture on Thursday evening. The president Eddie Clarke presided.

Mr. Sangster spoke on the Co-op Congress meeting which he attended at Hamilton, where many lessons on the co-op movement can be studied and readily understood.

He said that the Russians think that Communism will be universal by 1973. "All we have to do to make this sad thought a reality is keep listening to what other people tell us and do nothing about it," he stated.

Co-operation is a world calling today, saving the people economically, socially and spiritually is his message.

There are people in south eastern Asia, South Korea and Pakistan who are looking for assistance somewhere. What do they see in Canada? What do they find in the U.S.A.?

In the matter of weapons we have the latest and most devastating in human relations. We have great communication systems but nothing to say to each other. Sixty percent of the world is hungry yet we have tremendous surplus in foodstuffs. Therefore we have poor human relations. "That was what we strived for, organized for, sacrificed for, prayed for, fought for, and died for and having reached the goal of achievement we took a little time off to cheer on V-E Day."

In conclusion his worship said, "May we all combine in heart and spirit once more on this V-E Day to make this rejuvenation our further goal for victory everlasting and let us look backward."
