CURRENT NOTES.

The number of sea-going vessels entered inwards at the Quebec Custom House, from the opening of navigation up to 21st June, is 249. The clearance to the same date, including steamers and outports, are 137, leaving 112 vessels in port. There are 10 steamships and 18 sailing vessels in the port of Montreal.
