PHOTOGRAPH THE STOMACH.—Drs. Lang and Meltzing, of Berlin, describe an apparatus they have invented for photographing the interior of the stomach. The foremost end of the stomach tube contains a micro-copic camera and an electric light. When the stomach is emptied and filled with air, the apparatus photographs the most secret recesses. The negative is about the size of a cherry stone, but can be enlarged.

NOVA SCOTIA COAST RAILWAY.—Grading on the above road is completed from East Point, N. S., to Atwood Brook, 17 miles, on the section under contract from East Pubnico, northeast 66 miles, to Leckport, to H. J. Towser & Co., of New Glasgow, N. S. All the masonry is completed on the bridges for the same distance. New contract for the extension to Halifax via Leckport, Liverpool, Bridgewater, Lunenburg and Chester, 119 miles, will probably be let in May or June. The rails and rolling stock for the first twenty miles are ready for delivery. Work was closed down in December and will not be resumed until weather permits. A branch is to be surveyed this summer from Liverpool north 25 miles to Caledonia. The company expects to complete the entire enterprise by Dec. 31, 1900.

SQUEEZED HER HARD.—The most novel cause for a damage suit in the history of the courts of the United States was recently entered by Miss Elith Boone at Philadelphia. She asks that damages to the extent of \$15,000 be awarded her for the loss of the use of her hands, which she says were so badly injured by a squeeze given them by Frederick P. Farrow that she may have to have one of them amputated. Miss Boone is 17 years old. Farrow is a clerk in a drug store and boarded in the home of the complainant's sister. It was while playing cour to her that the excessive squeezing occurred. Physicians at the Polyclinic hospital say the metacarpal bones were crushed, and that necrosis is liable to result. Farrow acknowledges the squeezing, but says it was done while skylarking.

OFFERING AN INDUCEMENT.—The business people of Harmony, Minn., a town of 500 inhabitants, have developed a novelty in advertising that has been productive of much benefit. They get together one day in each week and offer a prize of \$5 to the farmer who drives the greatest distance to the town, on business. He must be a farmer, and he must come on business. He must market a few hogs, or kine, or some product of the farm, or he must come and do some trading, either buy some hardware or general merchandise, get a shave or patronize the dentist or doctor. He must prove conclusively the distance he came, and the farmer who has made the longest trip gets the purse. It has proved a drawing card for the town. The matter is thoroughly advertised in a local paper, and farmers subscribe to keep posted.

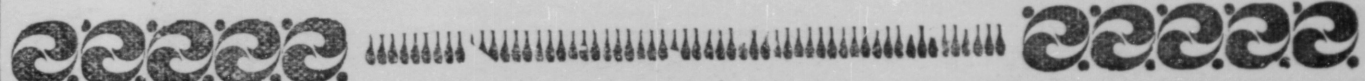
