

# Seven Fishermen Facing Charges

ALBERTON — A Campbellton fisherman, Loren Donald Shaw, was fined \$25 and costs and \$100 and costs by Magistrate W. Chester S. MacDonald, at Alberton yesterday, on two separate charges of fishing lobsters in a district not covered by his license.

In a court appearance last week he was fined \$10 and costs for a similar infraction of the lobster fishery regulations.

Four Tignish fishermen, Major Joseph Gaudet, Leo Joseph Richard, Jerry Joseph Gaudet and Cyrus Bernard received fines of \$25 and costs each for placing lobster gear on the fishing grounds during a closed season for that area.

George Kinch, Alberton South, pleaded not guilty to a charge of possession of 550 lobsters measuring less than two and a half inch carapace and the case was adjourned to Oct. 16.

Evidence was concluded in two charges against Wyman Milligan, Alberton South, fishing lobsters in a district not covered by his license and using a boat in lobster District 8 which had been used in District 7B in the spring season. The accused was found guilty and will be sentenced Oct. 16.

A charge against Layton James Wallace, Cascompe, of failing to stop at a stop sign was dismissed by the magistrate following the conclusion of evidence.

Frank Joseph Arsenault, Kelsey Road, was fined \$200 and costs when he pleaded guilty to a charge of keeping liquor for sale.

Two persons received fines of \$20 and costs for intoxication. Another was fined \$20 and costs for possession of liquor in a place other than his residence.

Robert Melvin Doucette, Tignish, was fined \$10 and costs for driving without a license.
