Opening lead—king of clubs. It is frequently more dangerous to declare to have one defender on the lead than the other. Declarer will therefore often try to arrange his plays so that the dangerous opponent is avoided. For an unusual application of this principle, we cite this hand.

West led the king of clubs and South was faced with the possibility of losing three spades and a diamond. On the bidding it seemed likely that West had the ace of spades. It was therefore imperative to try to keep East out of lead, so that the king of spades could not be attacked from that seat.

## Cancellation Questions Future Of Chemical Fuelled Bomber

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States Air Force Monday cancelled a \$100,000,000 program for the development of chemical fuel for use in bombers and fighter-interceptors of the classes whose speeds exceed 2,000 miles an hour.

The cancellation immediately raised speculation over the future of the multi-billion dollar program for the B-70 chemical fuelled bomber known as the Valkyrie and the F-108 fighter interceptor designated the Rapier.

The cancellation will knock out operation of a new \$45,000,000 chemical plant built by the Olin Mathieson Corporation at Model City, N.Y., near Buffalo.

The air force officially notified Congress that the prime contract with the General Electric Company for the J93-5 engine had been cancelled. The engine was to be used in both the B-70 and F-108.

## Sweeping Arrests Of Cubans Seen Attempt To Smash Plot

HAVANA, Cuba. (AP) — Military camps in and around Havana, reputed to hold hundreds of civilians and army men bagged in a government roundup, were sealed Monday.

Entry and exit were permitted only by authority of the commanders. Premier Fidel Castro's revolutionary regime, now in its eighth month, apparently is seeking through sweeping arrests to halt a purported plot to overthrow him.

The newspaper Revolution, organ of Castro's 25th of July movement, says that possibly more than 1,000 persons have been detained as a result of the discovery of "the counter-revolutionary conspiracy."

Revolution promises that Castro will go before the people by television and radio at an opportune moment—no date was specified—to explain the wave of rumors and arrests sweeping this island republic. A rebel radio spokesman said the government might make some kind of an announcement today.

**ARMS DISAPPEAR**  
Some sources said the roundup of suspects was set off by the disappearance of arms from Camp Libertad, a big military base in a Havana suburb, apparently in preparation for an armed uprising against Castro.

These sources claimed investigators seized more than 40 machine-guns, 100 U.S.-made M-1 (Garand) rifles and huge sums of money.

**SAILED BALTIC**  
TRELLEBORG, Sweden (Reuters)—Two East German brothers who sailed across the Baltic in two days in a small sailboat fitted with an outboard motor landed here Monday and asked for political asylum.

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
