CONTRACT BRIDGE

East dealer. East-West vulnerable. NORTH: ♠ Q 3 7, ♥ J 9 8, ♦ 10 9 8 4, ♣ K Q J. WEST: ♠ 10 5 4, ♥ 7 5 2, ♦ K 2, ♣ 10 8 6 3 2. EAST: ♠ 8 6 3 2, ♥ A Q 10 2, ♦ 7 5 3, ♣ A 4. SOUTH: ♠ A K 9, ♥ K 8 4, ♦ A Q J 6, ♣ 9 7 5.

The bidding: East South West North Pass 1NT Pass 3NT. Opening lead—three of clubs. There is an entirely different approach to the play of the defense than there is to the play of the dummy.

The declarer has the enormous advantage of knowing exactly what high cards are missing. He therefore has a much firmer grip on what suits to exploit, what dangers to avoid, and in general, how to make the most of the values he has. The defender can only feel his way, seeing, but a portion of his side's resources and a portion of declarer's. He has the bidding to go by, the interpretation he can place upon plays already made.

and, last but not least, his own ingenuity. Despite handicaps, the shrewd defender can give a good account of himself. It is by no means rare for him to be able to play his cards, hand after hand, just as effectively as declarer. All of which leads us to the problem faced by East after he won the club lead and had to decide what to return at trick two. He selected the queen of hearts an unusual play, we admit, but nonetheless the play called for by the particular circumstances. If South covered with the king, East's A-10 would form a tenace over dummy's J-9, and bring about declarer's defeat as soon as West obtained the lead to return a heart. Or if South ducked the queen, a low heart return would also defeat the contract as soon as West got in. How can East tell the effect of the queens of hearts play? The answer is he can't be sure just what will happen, but he has a pretty good idea. Since dummy's hand and his own together have 20 points, and declarer presumably 16 to 18, West must have 2 to 4 points. Unless West has an entry the contract cannot be defeated. East therefore proceeds on the basis West has the necessary entry. A low heart back will not do the trick. It must be the queen.

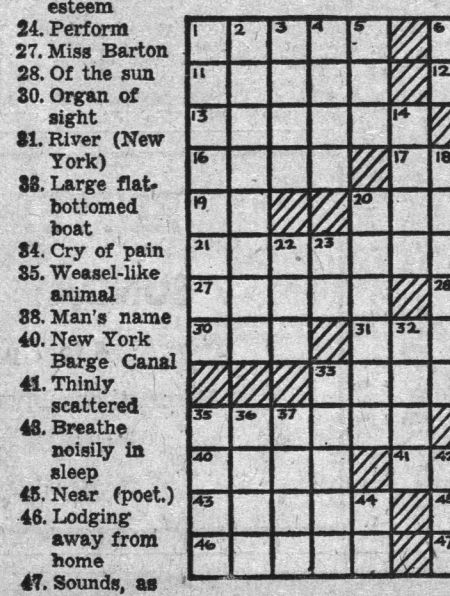

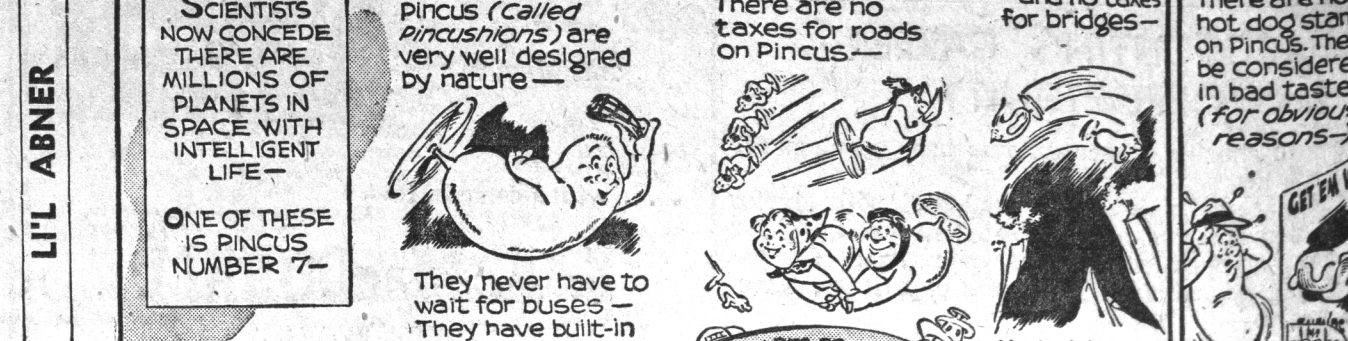
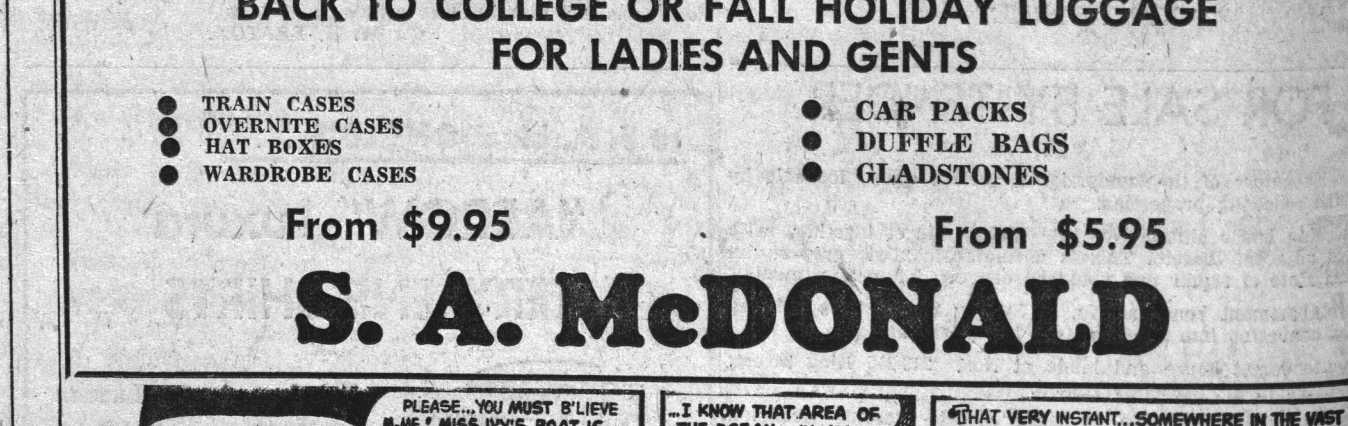
