

Local and Other Items.

CITY COUNCIL meets to-morrow evening at 7.30.

THE market was well attended to-day. No change has been reported in prices.

THE Cathedral clock has been repaired, and it is now running on accurate time.

MONSIGNOR MANNING, nephew of Cardinal Manning, and one of the papal chamberlains, is dead.

A DESPATCH to the St. John papers from Halifax reports two mercantile failures in this Province.

It is a gratifying fact that the number of Americans who obtain their college education within Canadian institutions is steadily increasing.

WANTED.—An heir for \$20,000. Thomas Armstrong died recently at Albany, U. S., leaving \$20,000, and no means of tracing the heirs, who are said to live in New Brunswick.

MEDICAL opinion in the United States goes to show that in Maine and other States which have prohibitory liquor laws, the use of opium is increasing with alarming rapidity.

CANADA'S growing crops continue to give fair promise of an abundant harvest, which tends to impart a brighter aspect to the business outlook generally, and the fall trade is now looked forward to with greater confidence.—*Montreal Star*

A PETITION to the Governor-General is in circulation at Halifax, praying for the admission into the country of American illuminating oil of the same grade as to explosive power is allowed in Canadian oil, viz., 105 degrees.

GO WEST, young men, and women, also, and attend the annual picnic of St. James' Sabbath School, at West River, to-morrow. An excellent day's amusement may be expected. The *Southport* will leave Ferry Wharf at 9.30 a. m., and at 2 o'clock p. m.

THE Chinese do not seem to be very justly dealt with by New York mobs. A Chinaman yesterday came near being lynched and was fatally shot for attempting to arrest a woman who had robbed him. They could hardly have done worse in San Francisco.

MR. ARCHIBALD MCKINNON, of Long Creek, West River, had in town, this morning, some new potatoes, the seed of which was planted on the 4th May. They were of the "early rose" variety.

AUSTROGARIANS-HUN are having more trouble with the Alabamians whose territory they occupied last year. It looks as if these Eastern people were incapable of keeping in a pacific mood for a year at a time. The crisis has resulted in the calling out of more Austrian troops.

It has been discovered that the German Ambassador had lately in his possession maps, estimates, and a plan of campaign for a possible war between Germany and Russia. As Russia has several provinces mainly peopled by Germans, which would seem naturally to belong to the German Empire, the discovery of these warlike preparations has excited both alarm and distrust.

CAPT. FRED BURNABY, of Khiva renown, has just been married in London to Miss Elizabeth A. F. Hawkins-Whitshed, only child of the late Sir St. Vincent Bentinck Hawkins-Whitshed. The Prince of Wales sent a wedding gift of a smoking-room service of blue and gold enamel. Captain Burnaby's gift to his bride was a tiara of diamonds, which she wore at her bridal.

THE annual examination of the pupils attending the Halifax Deaf and Dumb Institution was held last week. There are at present 46 pupils in the Institution, 22 of whom belong to Nova Scotia, 14 to New Brunswick, 5 to Newfoundland, and 5 to this Province. In the prize list we are pleased to observe the names of three Island students: Frank Murtart, of Souris; John McNeill, of Crapaud; and Lillie, McVane, of Bothwell.

THE towns along the lower Mississippi are again threatened with a visit of yellow fever. Another sweep of that dreadful plague through that sweltering region would be an awful calamity for its inhabitants, and a source of terrible danger to all having communication with them. It is to be hoped, however, that the experience won in the last conflict on the Mississippi with the dreadful pestilence will be turned to good account in the struggle with it apparently impending.

WE observe by late Halifax papers that the owners of horses or cattle found roaming at large in that city, are summoned before the Stipendiary Magistrate's court and fined \$2.00, and costs. How is it that horses and cattle are to be seen on the streets in this city—particularly in that part of the city leading to and from Connolly's wharf—and the police allow them to roam undisturbed, even after their attention has been called so the fact. Has the act for preventing horses and cattle running at large on the streets and Squares has been repealed?

SINGULAR SHOOTING ACCIDENT.—A young gentleman named Pierre Labouchere, who arrived at New York from Amsterdam a few days ago, was found on Monday last in the hallway, near the door of his parlor, in the Brunswick, with a pistol wound in his breast. He died on Thursday from the effects of his wound; and although the police set up the theory of suicide, the better opinion seems to be that he shot himself by accident. Mr. Labouchere was highly connected and wealthy, and was a second cousin of the well-known editor of *London Truth*.

THE annual convention of delegates of the Catholic Total Abstinence Societies of this Province will commence in St. Patrick's Hall, in this city, to-morrow. The delegates will attend at the Hall at 9 o'clock, a. m.; thence they will proceed to the Cathedral, to assist at a Pontifical High Mass. The sermon on the occasion will be preached by Rev. C. O'Brien, D. D. At 2 o'clock, p. m., there will be a business meeting in St. Patrick's Hall, at which delegates will present, in writing, a short report of the state and standing of their respective societies. At 6.30 lunch will be served to the members of the Convention in St. Dunstan's Reading Room. At 8 o'clock, p. m., there will be an open session of the Convention, with addresses and music.
