Unless we have a vision of life to which we can commit ourselves wholeheartedly, accept without reserve, and use as a guide in our everyday living, we shall always be restless in the face of life's problems.

Our minds are made for truth, and deep peace of mind only is attained to us when we have access to the truth we seek—a secure knowledge of what life is all about.

The Christian virtue of faith gives us this vision of the world and hence, meets this basic need of ours.

We also need someone to love. A vision of the meaningfulness of life is not enough. Part of that vision tells us that no man has within himself the source and completion of his own happiness.

We are meant to give ourselves to others, to serve them. It is

Life is, it is not enough to love someone, we must also know that the goal our vision and presents to us is attainable of us.

If this third ingredient is lacking, our whole life is marred at its source and our peace of soul is shattered. What good is something to believe in if that conviction brings nothing to me. If it holds no promise out to me why should I commit myself to it? My life is just as meaningless ultimately with it or without it.

**HUMAN LIMITATION**  
 What good is someone to love if my love for them is limited to a few fleeting years? Love by its very nature demands that it be boundless and yet my ability to love is fenced in all around, not least by the ultimate barrier to human achievement, death itself.

It is precisely against the limitations of human existence itself that Christian hope is directed. Surely, it is obvious that we ourselves cannot overcome the limitations of our nature.

If they are to be surmounted, it can only be by God reaching down into our lives and giving us what is otherwise beyond our grasp. This is what life has done in sending His Son into the world to draw us back to Him.
