THE BRITISH CAMPAIGN.

The Unionists are still confident of victory at the forthcoming parliamentary general election, but there is an under-current of apprehension that the party will be returned to power with a smaller majority than has been expected. The St. James Gazette says:

"If we are to have a triumphant majority, we must watch early and late, and work hard all the time."

Mr. Arthur J. Balfour made what the Daily Mail calls a "disappointing" speech at Manchester last evening, where he declared that the agitation for army reform was a "red-herring drawn across the track of the South African settlement by Radicals who usually care nothing about military questions." Taking him to task editorially for this statement, the Daily Mail declares that the "country is very serious upon any army reform and will not stand the retention of Lord Lansdowne."

Mr. Geo. Wyndham, parliamentary under secretary of state for war, who went to speak in favor of the Unionist candidate in Battersea, London, had a very hostile reception at the hands of the Radicals. He was shouted down by a howling mob, and compelled to abandon his attempt to speak, but he pluckily fought his way through the hostile crowd, which, in admiration of his courage, finally cheered him heartily.

Mr. Joseph Chamberlain, secretary of state for the colonies, addressing a Unionist meeting at Tunstall, referred to the "Mushroom growth of Liberal 'imperialists,'" and warned the country that if the Liberals were returned to power, they would restore independence to the Boer republics.

The campaign of oratory continues on all sides with undiminished vigor. Mr. Herbert Henry Asquith, former Liberal home secretary, being especially energetic.

Mr. Chamberlain, the colonial secretary, has written in the letter which he says the Dutch republic has been annexed he does not expect any formal declaration of peace. He asserts that he does not know whether the Queen intends to fix a day of national thanksgiving.

That the officers and men in the German army are firm in the belief that war is imminent between Germany and China is reflected in the unusual number of applications which have been made to a line insurance company in this Berlin policies on

Information which came from Berlin was of such a character that the declaration of war was believed to be close at hand. With each application there was a request that it should be issued at once and the risk be made binding.

Do you wish to make loyal Englishmen of the Boers and avoid endless trouble in the future? Then have one official language only in South Africa. All the trouble between French and English in Canada might have been averted had English been the only official language allowed in the country.

"A Canadian" is perfectly right.

It is stated that seventeen thousand applications have been made to join the new police force that is being organized for service in the Transvaal. The eagerness to join is ascribed chiefly to the popularity of Asger Baden-Powell.
