**Round Table  
Wins Handicap**

ARCADIA, Calif. (AP)—Round  
Table, carrying a staggering 133  
pounds, set a track record as he  
routed home by five lengths in  
the \$27,350 San Marcos Handicap  
over 1 1/4 miles on the grass at  
Santa Anita Saturday.  
The time of 1:56 3/4 was also  
a North American grass course  
record.  
Spotting the field 18 to 26  
pounds, racing's all-time money  
winner led all the way around the  
rolling course and pulled away at  
will in the back stretch. Willie  
Shoemaker was looking back  
through the stretch as the Table  
glided to the wire.  
The winner's share of \$15,700  
boosted the Table's total earn-  
ings to \$1,363,180.  
Little Eddie Schmidt was sec-  
ond, followed by Andrew Alan.  
It was the first time in Santa  
Anita's history that a horse had  
lugged more than 130 pounds into  
the winner's circle. Discovery and  
Citation had tried, but failed.  
It was the fifth time in the  
Table's magnificent career that  
he has been under two minutes  
for 1 1/4 miles. No other thourgh-  
bred has cracked two minutes for  
the distance more than twice.  
Round Table is owned by Travis  
M. Kerr of Oklahoma.

**Trimble Denies  
Signing Contract  
With Packers**

HAMILTON (CP)—Jim Trimble,  
head coach of Hamilton  
Tiger-Cats of the Big Four Foot-  
ball League, said Saturday he has  
not signed a contract to coach  
Green Bay Packers and doesn't  
intend to.  
"This is the same story that  
comes up every year," he said.  
"It is not true."  
Earlier, Hamilton general man-  
ager Jake Gaudaur said a Mil-  
waukee report that Trimble  
would be the 1939 coach of the  
Green Bay club is "completely  
untrue."  
Oliver E. Kuechle, sports ed-  
itor of the Milwaukee Journal,  
said Friday in a television broad-  
cast that a deal to land Trimble  
with the National Football  
League team had been com-  
pleted.
