Canadian Lawyer Heads Red Cross International Law Body

A Canadian delegate to the International Red Cross Conference, now being held in New Delhi, India, has been highly honoured by the supreme governing body of the Red Cross. John A. Macaulay, Q.C., of Winnipeg, was chosen today to serve as chairman of the International Humanitarian Law Commission. He was elected by representatives of over 70 Red Cross, Red Crescent and Red Lion and Sun Societies, the International Committee of the Red Cross and representatives of governments throughout the world. The Commission of International Humanitarian Law is considered the most important Commission of the International Red Cross Conference and will deal with the Draft Rules for the Limitation of the Damages Incurred by the Civilian Population in Time of War submitted by the International Committee of the Red Cross and representatives of the humanitarian Geneva Conventions and such
