LONG RANGED GUNS.

One Which Carries Over Fifteen Miles Costs a Fortune.

For practical purposes from twelve to thirteen miles is the range of the most powerful Armstrong guns now used. This distance has, however, been considerably exceeded by Krupp's 130-ton steel gun, which fired a shot weighing 2,000 pounds a distance of a few yards over fifteen miles. The gun cost \$225,000, and each projectile \$4,750. The 11-ton Armstrong gun has an extreme range of fourteen miles, firing a shot weighing 1,800 pounds, and requiring 900 pounds of powder. The enormous expense of these large guns has led to their being practically abandoned, for besides the actual cost of each shot, the gun itself was unable to bear the strain of even being fired a limited time. The ambition to attain longer range has been superseded by that of securing rapidity of firing—at once more economical and effective in active warfare.

To Reach the Pole Point.

If Dr. Nansen has really got to the North Pole, how is he going to prove it? This question has been asked repeatedly of late, and scientists have been unable to give a satisfactory answer to the problem. Prof. Dyche of Kansas, who is now organizing a polar expedition, explains how absolute proof of the success of his venture may be given if he is lucky enough to reach the North Pole. "I will take a bullet and suspend it from a string," says Prof. Dyche. "This bullet will cast a shadow. In our latitude that shadow would in a day's time describe an ellipse. At the North Pole the shadow would make a perfect circle. I will photograph the shadow throughout the day. Of course, it will be necessary to bring back only an arc or part of a circle. As a day at the pole is six months long, it would be practically impossible to get a picture of the entire circle. Any part of it, however, would be enough to convince a scientist that I had reached the North Pole."

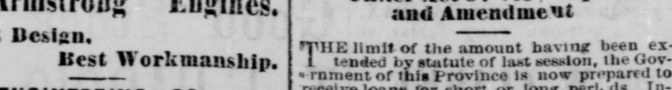
