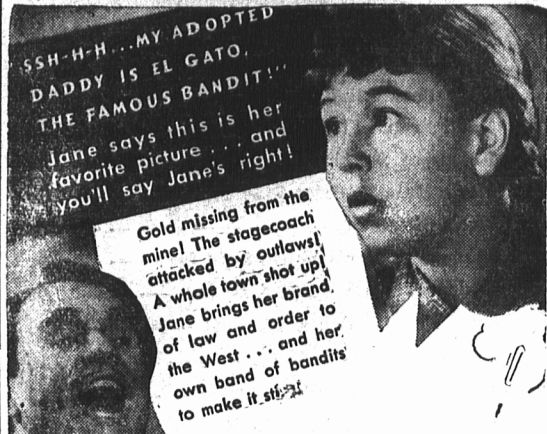

TEMPERATURE DOWN SLIGHTLY—Although the mercury stood at 85 yesterday, one point lower than Wednesday, warmest day this year, Prince Edward Islanders felt the heat more. According to Mr. Warren Burns, meteorologist at the Dominion Experimental Farm here, this was due to high humidity and the absence of breeze. Indications pointed to the same brand of weather for today, he said.

TANDEM BICYCLE BUILT—A bicycle "built for two" has made its appearance in Charlottetown. The machine attracted considerable attention as it was driven about the city by two young men last night. The vehicle was manufactured locally from parts of two standard bikes. The forward hand of the composite machine is the frame of a girls bicycle while the rear part is the frame of a man's wheel.
