

Aid Offered Rail Clerks Losing Jobs

PALM BEACH, Fla. (AP)—A presidential emergency board has recommended that the Southern Pacific Railroad use part of its cost savings from the new automatic train control to provide benefits for railrover clerks losing jobs.

The board, established by the three-man board is to form the basis for renewed negotiations between the rail line and the clerks union, at loggheads on the issue for the last year. Bishop Refuses To Oust Priest

HAARLEM, The Netherlands (Reuters)—The Roman Catholic Bishop of Haarlem announced Wednesday he will not dismiss a Dutch Jesuit as student chaplain despite representations by the Holy Office in Rome.

It was reported Dec. 19 the bishop had received a letter from the Holy Office advising M. Wallace McCutcheon, Toronto industrialist and federal cabinet minister.

Bishop Refuses To Oust Priest

This followed a speech by the chaplain in Rotterdam Sept. 30 in which he criticized the Roman Curia (the church's administration) as "a closed and carefully selected group which rejects any interference from outside."

He also spoke of "a silent loss of faith of hundreds every year" which he claimed was due to "spiritual terrorism" which these Christians read into the language of the Roman Curia.

Wednesday's announcement said the Bishop of Haarlem had been in touch with Cardinal Ottaviani, secretary of the Holy Office, on the matter and "the Holy Office maintains its objections to the way in which Father Van Kilsdonk opposed the Roman Curia."

However, the announcement went on, the Holy Office will leave further measures to the local bishop and "the Bishop of Haarlem will not dismiss Father Van Kilsdonk as student chaplain."

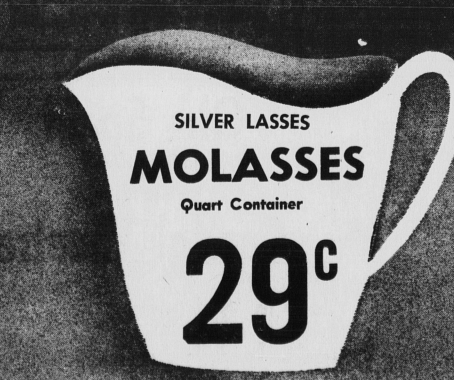

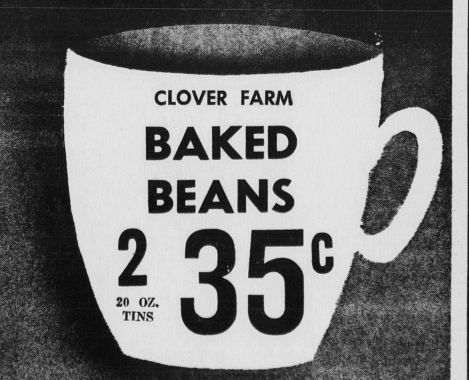
