Garden and Farm Hints.

Advance. Keep a record. Tar sheep's noses. Take your holiday. Work for success. Weed out poor hens. Observe rigid cleanliness. Insure the farm buildings. Hot weather favors vermin. Late cabbages require rich soil. A pig loves a run in the clover. Buckwheat mellows cloddy lands. Give a frequent change of pasture. Unclean stables breed bad disorders. Pure drinking water is of the first value.

Harvest the wheat in the "doughy" state. A hundred-day pig may be very profitable. Young stock need a separate feeding-pace. Timber cut in mid-summer is most durable. Improve the live stock through better males. Protect work horses from flies with sheets. Ripe, woody, late cut grass does not make good hay. Sheep need shade and shelter, as well as food and water. Top-dress newly mown meadows with fine manure. A clover sod turned under is a heavy coat of manure. Poor layers and bad mothers should go to the block. Salt the stock once a week; not necessarily on Sunday. Dry earth makes good bedding for cattle in mid-summer. Give work horses frequent and small drinks of cool, pure water. Flat turnips sown now, will yield excellent food for sheep in late autumn. Place a wet cloth in the crown of the straw hat; it may prevent sun-stroke. Manure begins to draw interest as soon as spread, payable at the next harvest. Horses as well as boys enjoy an evening bath. They are profited by it if lasting only a few minutes, and they are subsequently rubbed dry.

Stories of Animals.

Thomas Bell, the naturalist, tells a story of how a spider caught a tartar. A big bluebottle fly bounced into a spider's web. The spider hastily presented himself, and threw his long arms around the fly. The fly returned the compliment, and after battering and tearing the web to pieces, flew away with the spider.

Two weasels were so absorbed in the fight for a mouse in a suburb of Louisville, Ky., that they did not hear a farmer approach. Each had hold of the mouse pulling in opposite directions.
