### A TELLING TOUR.

The success of the recent Conservative meetings at Montreal makes it easy to accept the accounts of the large attendances at the demonstrations which Sir Charles Tupper and his colleagues are addressing in Ontario. It is natural enough in its way that three such men should get good audiences. Sir Charles Tupper is a veteran of politics, who won his first renown before most people in Canada were born. He took a foremost part in the movements, now only memories to most voters, which led to the formation and consolidation of the Canadian Dominion. He is the greatest of the few surviving fathers of Confederation. He is making his last appeal to the people of the country with whose beginnings his name will always be associated. Mr Foster is in the front of the oratorical talent of Parliament, with a reputation as a financial administrator second to none in Canada. Mr Hugh John Macdonald besides by his name, is commended to public favor by as manly a record in public life as any who have served the country in provincial or federal spheres can lay claim to. It is only now and again that three such men appear in conjunction. There is reason to hold, however, that interest in the cause they represent, as well as their personality, is an attractive force in connection with their tour. There were many things that made the verdict of 1896, on the great majority of the issues then up, an incorrect one. Everywhere, outside of this province, the Manitoba school issue was one on which the mass of opinion was against the Conservatives. It was respect for the constitution and what Parliament had pledged itself to, and not sympathy with the separate school idea, that caused the majority of Protestant Conservatives to vote for the principle of the Remedial Bill, and "coercion" as it was called. Many refused. Mr Dalton McCarthy led thousands from the Conservative to the Liberal camp; thousands more were made lukewarm or indifferent. The idea was abroad, and was industriously propagated by the Liberal party's orators and writers, that the Quebec wing of the Conservative party was paramount in its councils, and was driving it into improper courses. With Quebec going over to Sir Wilfrid Laurier in a mass, and Sir Wilfrid Laurier's turning the Roman Catholics of Manitoba over to Mr. Greenway's tender mercies, the great cause of Conservative dissatisfaction with the Conservative parliamentary policy was removed. The end was put to McCarthyism when its two representatives in Parliament skulked out of the House of Commons rather than

vote against their Liberal masters on the emergency food scandal division. The Laurier Government has done nothing to hold the recruits that rallied so timely to its cause. Its leading supporters signed a memorial asking for the appointment of a papal delegate to come over and discipline Conservatives who condemned Sir Wilfrid Laurier's double policy in matters where the Church was interested. Neither Conservatives nor any others have been made enthusiastic for what triumphant Liberalism means—Sifton officials, Blair deals, Tarte jobs, Borden partisanship, a recklessly high expenditure, and a defiance of almost every principle that Liberals had held up as sacred. In federal politics the experience of eight general elections shows the country to be Conservative. Opinion was stamped in 1873 over the Pacific Railway charter charges, and it was confused in 1896 by the varied attitudes assumed by Sir Wilfrid Laurier's party on practically every issue that was under discussion. It is today neither stamped nor confused. It is in a position to judge the Liberal Government, not on the differing pledges of its members, but on its concrete record. Whatever forces this into discussion tells against it and in favor of its opponents, and the tour of the leaders is forcing the discussion most effectively. Its influence will be seen when the ballots are counted.—Montreal Gazette.
