Thoughts For Our Time

Whether in individuals or in governments, that detestable attitude known as anti-Christianity, not a problem distinct from the attitude known as anti-Semitism, sooner or later give hate-filled witness to each other. One need not go so far as Europe or Asia for daily proof of this sad calamity within the human race.

Then, urged by an angel of the Lord, Joseph, Mary and the Infant Jesus fled into Egypt—the first Jewish refugees of the Christian era and the first Christian refugees of Jewish times. Those swords which slew the Jewish babies were aimed as well at Christianity's Christ. Hatred against the one was simultaneously hatred against the other.

Basically there is no difference between the vicious injustice of the persecutions by a Hitler and those by a Stalin. Sooner or later as recent months testify, the objects of persecution become not just Jews, but just Christians, but all Christians and all Jews.

The right to speak out on persecution and the right to be heard on persecution, involve one in forcibly condemning persecution no matter where he sees it, and no matter who is persecuted by it a Jew, a Protestant or Catholic.

No, the tormenting of Jews and Christians, individually or collectively, must not be considered as separate questions. For we are all children of God and the revealed words of Scripture instruct us: 'For there is no distinction of the Jew and the Greek; for the same is Lord over all, rich unto all that call upon Him.' (Romans x:12.)

At the dawn of Christian history the prototype of modern persecutions was Herod, tetrarch of Galilee. Neither a Roman, nor a Greek, nor a Jew, Herod was a barbarian Arab, ruling the Jewish people for the Romans. His action is instructive for the problem I am discussing.

The Wise Men from the East asked Herod: 'Where is He that is born King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the East and have come to worship Him.' Herod, exceedingly troubled, assembled the chief priests and scribes of the people and inquired of them where Christ should be born. Basing themselves on a 600-year-old prophecy by Micah, they told him in Bethlehem of Judea. 'With a solicitude whose falsity
