Local and Other Items.

SEIZED AT SOURIS.—The little hooker from French St. Pierre, suspected as having brought the liquor found in Rollo Bay woods, has been seized by the customs. She is now tied up at Souris and her owners are prepared to go home without her.

NEW BARREL FACTORY.—Among the latest evidences of enterprise in Souris may be seen the now nearly completed large new barrel factory on Chapel Street owned by the industrious and enterprising firm of St. John Bros.

KEEP AT IT.—Dr Clift, of this city, has an interesting letter in the last issue of the Advocate impressing upon the people of Picton the necessity of constructing a system of sewerage and waterworks in that town. This is the second letter that Dr Clift has had in the Advocate treating of the same matter. The Dr is working along the right line and should keep at it.

GLENWOOD.—The Glenwood farm situated about a mile from Souris is one of the handsomest localities for a private residence or a hotel anywhere to be seen along the coast. Its owner Mr. Archibald McDonald, has lately erected a fine dwelling house which commands a good view of Souris and surrounding country.

A DOUBTFUL STORY.—The Toronto Telegram's London cable says: Three seventeen knot steamships have been purchased for the Canadian line between Milford Haven and Passaic, Que., the first sailing in November. Satisfactory arrangements have been made for a special service of trains between London and Milford Haven.

WHY TEETH DECAY.—The question to what extent the alkaline earth salts in drinking water affect the decay of teeth has of late been studied in several quarters. Statistics have been collected by Reese in several localities in Bavaria and by Foerberg in Sweden. These have revealed the interesting fact that the extent of decaying teeth bears a definite relation to the hardness of the water—in other words to the quantity of calcium and magnesium salts in the earth through which the water passes. The harder the water the better the teeth; the smaller the quantity of these salts the greater the decay of the teeth.—Sudd. Apoth. Ztg.
