Heart Stopped While In Dentist's Chair Girl Recovers

SHEFFIELD, England, June 16—(A.P.)—British medical circles today heard the astounding story of Mary Devonport's seven-minute interval of "death" in a dental chair, how she lost 24 teeth and how she went back to work in a steel factory.

"The case poses a question for those who believe the soul leaves the body on the instant of death," remarked Dr. Alfred A. Masser of Sheffield. He described the case for the British medical journal.

Dr. Masser reported the 20-year-old girl's heart stopped beating shortly after chloroform had been administered preliminary to having her teeth extracted by a dentist. "I decided to try an intra-cardiac injection of 'coral,' plunging a long needle into the left ventricle about the level of the fourth space,

and slowly injected the 'coral.' "In about one minute I could see a faint flicker of pulsation in the external jugular vein of the neck. "After another 10 minutes of artificial respiration the breathing recommenced and the pulse at the wrist gradually returned. "Her condition gradually improved so much that I decided to continue the anaesthetic with open ether, and the dentist proceeded to remove about 24 teeth. "The report added the girl made an uneventful recovery. She went back to work two days later.

Armless Golfer Makes Record

WINDSOR, Ont., June 16—(C.P.)—A small gallery at Lakewood Golf Club Saturday saw Thomas McAuliffe, who lost both arms in a railway accident 38 years ago, do the first nine holes of the course in an even 90 strokes. McAuliffe, the only armless golfer

in the world, makes his smooth, fairly strong shots by holding his club between his chin and shoulder swinging his body. His card of 90 for nine was not as well as he generally does. He once shot an 88 for 18 holes on a Buffalo course. For a time he was golf editor of a Buffalo daily newspaper, could type 35 words a minute by holding a pencil in his mouth and using it to poke the keys.

Married, with four children, McAuliffe is 42 years old. He lives in Detroit, to which city he came a year ago to edit Crutch and Case, a service monthly for the physically disabled.

Dionne's Expect New Arrival Sept. 1

CALLANDER, Ont., June 16—(C.P.)—About Sept. 1, it appeared certain today, Mrs. O'iva Dionne will give birth to her 12th child, a brother or sister for the famous quintuplets who live across the road from their parents. A source close to the family said the confinement was expected in late summer or early fall.

Neither Mr nor Mrs. Dionne would confirm or deny the report, but it was understood the mother of the quintis had several times consulted a physician about her approaching confinement. Dr. Allan Roy Dafeo, country doctor who attended the birth of the quintuplets, was not consulted.

FREDERICTON, N.B., June 16—Following the morning service at Christ Church Cathedral here Sunday, Very Rev. Dean J. H. A. Holmes was presented a silver tray on behalf of the Cathedral congregation. The presentation was made in the Cathedral Memorial Hall, with a large number of the congregation present.

Dean Holmes has been appointed Professor of Divinity and Dean of the Faculty of the Divinity School of the University of King's College, Halifax, and Sunday's sermon was his last before relinquishing his duties as Dean here. He will be succeeded by Rev. W. Moorhead, Saint John.
