

Hornless Cattle and their Merits.

The Polled breed best combining excellent beef and dairy qualities is found in the counties of Norfolk and Suffolk in England. Although the cattle are essentially of the same, in colour, size and fine points they are precisely like Devon cattle, and are sometimes called the Hornless Devon. Picked cows of the above breed give as much milk as the Guernsey or Jersey, and it is often nearly as rich, and makes as much butter. Seven to ten pounds of butter per week is not an uncommon yield from them, especially those bred in Suffolk county; and their yield has occasionally run up from the above weights to 14 and 20 lbs. per week for a short time, when well fed and at the best of the season. But these yields are extraordinary, and cannot be calculated upon as a general thing. A few red Norfolk polled cattle were imported into the state of New York several years ago, and have been bred here with care, and are much liked by dairy-men. Red Polled cattle are also bred in the north of England and south of Scotland. They are called the Galloway breed, and it was of a cow of one of these that late Mr. Charles Colting, about the year 1790, put his Shorthorn bull Bollingbroke, and from the produce of this came in the third generation a cow called Lady, and from her is descended what is called the "alloy" in the Shorthorn cattle. There are black Polled cattle also in the south of Scotland, called Galloway. They are excellent beef animals, but the cows give only small quantities of milk, which is usually of a rich quality.

There are other black Polled cattle bred in the northern districts of Scotland. The name of these is Angus, but they are frequently called Aberdeen, because mostly bred in that county. They are also called after the names of adjoining counties, and even after the estate where bred. This ought not to be permitted, as it makes a great confusion of names. A call of a red, and even a brindled colour, is occasionally dropped in the black Polled cattle. They are usually butchered and not bred from, the object being here to breed all of black colour. The Angus cattle are nearly as large as Shorthorns and Herefords, and the quality of their beef is rather superior to either of these. They make famous bullocks, grow rapidly, and mature early. The cows, as with the Galloway, give only a moderate mess of pretty rich milk. There are a few white Polled cattle in England, which are considerably larger than the red ones, and are said to be great milkers; but I hear little of them. It is proposed to cross Shorthorn bulls with milking families on these cows, keep only such calves as are dropped hornless, and thus create a new breed, large and fine, combining in them superior beef and dairy qualities. We might pick up the best of the Polled cows which are found scattered in various parts of the United States, breed them to Shorthorn bulls from great milking families, as the English are doing, and thus make a highly valuable breed among ourselves quite as good as any that could be imported. The great merit of Polled cattle is, that they are docile and of a peaceable disposition, and being without horns, require no special care, nor other animals, nor themselves. They are more easily and comfortably transported in cars or ships than the horned, and can be bred and reared at least ten per cent. cheaper.—A. B. Aiken, in N. Y. Tribune.

Brotherly Love.

SUMMARY OF THE SERMON PREACHED BY REV. ALFRED OSBORNE TO THE OFFICERS OF THIS CITY ON THEIR NATAL DAY.

1. John IV., 20. "If a man say, I love God, and hateth his brother, he is a liar." In Verse 10 there is a truth: "Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us, and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins." In Verse 19, it is a duty: "Beloved, if God so loved us, we ought also to love one another." From the truth springs the duty. The declaration of revelation is that God is a Father, and that He shows us a principle of God's love not meet the sacrifice of self. From this we learn that if we would be God-like there must be in us self-sacrifice. We must be careful to discriminate betwixt that love of herding or consorting with our kind, common to most animals as well as man (this is not meet the position), and that love of giving up ourselves for others. The mere love of company is self-pleasing—not a self-sacrificing duty. True strength comes from love, but all brotherhood should be for some object, to carry out some duty, should they lay the outcome of inward truth. God has made it possible for us to love Him, though we have not seen Him (verse 20), for He has revealed grace and mercy to us. It is true that He has revealed Himself in nature. The visible things of creation should make us sufficiently apprehensive of the love of God (Rom. I., 20). The rain falls, the sun shines upon the just and upon the unjust; but history shows us that people with the highest advantages had not the goodness of God, or His works in nature. St. John here confines himself to God's work in grace as the Truth of Revelation, as the Truth of the God manifest in Flesh, as the Truth which would regenerate our race. Now our Order is based on Truth—as Truth as an abstract speculation, but on the Truth manifested by God in Flesh—the Truth of Sacrifice. It is this which shows men at the foot of the cross. It is this which is caught up in the Calvary which constitutes Christianity, and any society which professes to work on the principle of this Truth, is working, or at least professing to work, on the Divine law, in conformity with the Divine mind. I profess that our hearts go out in impulse to that God, "because He has so loved us that we love Him." Have we been warmed by a ray from that Divine life, and do we reflect it, show it back on God? This is the profession and confession of many a man, and he calls himself a Christian because within him burns the same holy flame that impelled the everlasting Jehovah to give His Son for us. It appears, or may be inferred, from the text, that some had contented themselves with the profession of godliness. It is an error into which many fall. Every denomination of Christians contains men of this stamp—men that rest in some vague feeling of warmth, and believe themselves to be reflecting the love of God, and that such constitutes all the godlikeness which is Christian. But they are in error. Away in the eternity, God always reflected Himself in the person of His Son. There was no portion of the "Brightness of His glory" unreflected in the Son, infinite Wisdom, Goodness, Grace, Glory, Holiness, Love—all were thrown back upon God the Father, by God the Son, but such did not constitute the lesson of our Epistle. Any personality that reflected God as God, and not himself, is in love with God, and so, "If a man say, I love God, and hateth his brother, he is a liar." And why? Because the two spirits cannot agree. Love and hatred are contrary the one to the other in this instance, and so springs, natural to grace, the effect, the fruit, of Friendship and Love. He that has learned only to feel good, has learned but a part; for he has not yet learned that which is expressed by the word of Christ. It is a false religion which sits feeling, without working out the effect of the truth which is professed. Man, was made in the image of God. He that loves God, loves God's image, and his own brother. If his feeling towards man be contrary to his professed feelings towards God, the man's life is a lying lie. He is in error, and his heart is hypocritical, and the world is right too! You that show godlikeness to the world from the Truth received and felt, you are manifesting Christ and so are manifesting God. This is a higher position than that of the animal which feels pleasure, only because another animal is alongside of it. This latter is nature only, and is not of the essence of self sacrifice; the other is grace and is of God, who gave Himself for us. Brotherly love is the special manifestation of the obedience that springs from the walk in the light. By your lives then, you shall evidence whether you are led by God's Truth. An Odd Fellow should do no wrong to any man, and he is especially bound not to harm his brother Odd Fellow. His principles of brotherhood do not cease at it. There may be weak brethren among you. That man who professes to be led by the Truth to Friendship and Love, will not, for instance, place the bottle or the glass in the hand of the weak brother, because, by doing so, he is telling to the world that either Odd Fellowship is a lie, or he is living and acting contrary to his profession, so his life is a lie. Every time wrong of any kind is done, the triple link of his brightness, and the glory of your Order is dimmed. Man's actions are trumpets, they sound either the false or the true. The world judges by actions; it cannot get to the inner feeling, except so far as is manifested by the life. "By their fruits, ye shall know them" stands to day and any and every circumstance. If the very truth which cannot be gaisnyed. Then brethren, be careful to preserve, at all cost your principles. Let Truth be your motto, the Truth of God. Do not swerve from the straight path for anybody, or anybody, in the name of Man's actions. Never let the fine gold of Odd Fellowship become dross. Just as you learn the Truth of God, show it forth, for you cannot break the bond—Friendship and Love—a Truth, and from the Truth. In this regard, do not make the dust of your feet, as you walk in the light. Life is gliding away, and the players are hastening from the stage, the scenes are shifting, but he that goes from this life in brotherly love, wrought out from the grand principle which shall find a brotherhood, who there is no change nor decay. You shall be, brothers, the friends of God, face to face. Love shall glid every action. Truth shall sit enthroned as Kings. Every King shall bow in glad homage, and in the bond of an eternal fellowship you shall enjoy the cycles of the ages. You shall be overwhelmed with the glory of God. Like some Alpine Avalanche, it shall be borne irresistibly upon you, but not to your destruction, and yet you shall be swallowed up in Love.

Summerside Notes.

Angus McMillan, Esq., returned home on Tuesday last, after spending six or seven weeks in the United States.

The steamer St. Lawrence arrived here on Tuesday morning, at 9 o'clock, and left for Point Du Chen, returning to this place at 7:30 the same evening. This being her first trip for the season, gave the town quite a novelty. The steamer was captained by Mr. J. H. Stewart. Instead of having two policemen doing nothing, as has been the case, our Town Council have come to the conclusion that one man can do the work just as easily and quite as well as two. This conclusion has been arrived at after the police had asked for an increase of pay, and upon their resignations, which the Council accepted, they to continue their duties until the 1st of May. They have been receiving \$20 a month each since the 1st of May. This they considered not sufficient, and were, we learned, willing to fulfil their ordinary duties upon receiving an advance of \$4 a month. On Monday night last the Council accepted the tender of Shepard Mann, as a night policeman, for \$30 a month.

Another move was made in regard to the working of the Scott Act in Summerside on Tuesday night last. At a meeting held in Ludlow Hall on that evening at which the Government Officer, Mr. James Caldwell, was present, but which it was his intention to attend to these cases now pending in the Supreme Court, in order to test the validity of the Act. There can be no denying the fact that the Act, so far, has proven to be a worthless thing. The sale of intoxicating liquors has been rapidly increasing, and in fact rum-sellers have it all their own way. It is high time that something was done to counteract the cause through this open and barefaced violation of the law. The liquor is sold in Summerside, and is being sold there without let or hindrance, and the town which, previous to the Scott Act, was able to collect a large sum in the shape of license fees and fines for violation, etc., has now to put up with a paltry fine of \$2 or \$3 from some poor unfortunate who has been brought before the Court for drunkenness, while these men who sell the liquor are allowed to go free.

Pacific Railway Lands.

(From the Monetary Times.) The Pacific Railway Company has issued a prospectus, in England, offering, until further notice, to sell its lands at the low price of \$2.50 an acre, and to give a rebate of \$1.25 for every acre brought under cultivation within three years. The lands are offered at the rate of purchase, according to the nature and extent of the other improvements made thereon. There is nothing to indicate that this price is to be restricted to any portion of the company's lands. The "sell its lands" are general, and it would seem, on the face of its announcement, that the first comers will have the best choice. If we are to take the announcement in this sense, it must be allowed that the price is very low, being no more than the value of the lands in western lands for sale, without any rebate for improvements. The price is, too, far below that charged by the Northern Pacific Railway Co. The rebate for improvements offers the strongest inducement. The idea originated with the St. Paul and Minneapolis Railway Company, and the Canada Pacific Company is the natural heir to it. A railway company has a greater interest in the lands being made productive than private individuals, and it is because every limited of grain exported pays railway rates. It is gratifying to see the Pacific Railway Company preferring to encourage rapid settlement, by selling its lands at low prices, rather than attempting to start a high price for them, the effect of a startling extortion. So far as the price now set for the lands is an indication of the settled policy of the company, it must banish the fears of those who dreaded a policy of high prices and monopoly on the part of the Syndicate.
