The first case was Fred Nicholson and Isabella Nicholson, plaintiffs, represented by J.P. Nicholson, and defendants Frederick Merrill Acorn and Hugh Edward MacPhee, represented by S.E. Trainor and G.R. Foster. The case arose from personal injuries sustained from a motor accident. The case will be heard at Charlottetown on Sept. 17.

The second case was that of Raymond McKesman plaintiff, represented by J.O.C. Campbell, Q. C. vs. Traders General Insurance, represented by J.P. Nicholson, an action on an insurance policy. The petit jury is called for 11 a. m. today at Georgetown.
