We are indebted for this name, as we are for those of the days of the week, to a survival of the old Teutonic mythology.

To the Germans it is known as Oster, and to the Anglo-Saxon as Easter, or Eastre, a name derived from Eostre or Ostara, the Anglo-Saxon goddess of spring.

Dark indeed, was the closing in of the preceding Friday, when in the grave of Joseph of Arimathea, the disciples, the loving woman, and the few who had dared to follow the way of the Nazareth, lay buried with their Master, their last hope, as they looked over that wonderful life, they had been struck with astonishment at this marvelous work, were confused by the mysterious sayings and joyful surprise, hope and despair—were constantly agitating their thoughts as they attended the teaching of this man.
