

Medical Society Told of Mercy Flight Plan

At the monthly meeting of the Prince Edward Island Medical Society, Health Officer Robert McNeill announced a formula which should alleviate the problem of mercy flights.

The formula, Dr. McNeill said was devised after talks he held yesterday with two representatives of the department of transport.

Commenting on the situation he stated, "I don't feel that severely or critically injured people should be transported by a service which doesn't have the proper equipment or medical personnel."

During the past few months Atlantic Central Airlines of Montreal has been carrying out the flights at the rate of \$30 per hour. The average flight to Halifax, which was made in a Piper Cub plane took three hours. The service formerly was supplied free of charge by the RCAF.

Dr. McNeill advised the physicians of the island of his formula in a letter which read as follows:

"We have been investigating the air transportation of patients requiring emergency treatment over the past few months, and it appears that in some cases Atlantic Central Airlines are attempting to transport critically ill people without suitable equipment.

"I would suggest that all doctors give serious consideration to the needs of each individual patient requiring emergency transport as to whether such patient can be safely evacuated by the aircraft and equipment provided by the company or whether the medical condition requires the larger and special equipped planes as provided by the RCAF."

"We are led to believe that if requests are made for RCAF service, it will be provided if the doctor includes the medical reasons for requesting such equipment. In such cases and in order to expedite air evacuation by RCAF it is suggested that all requests other than those directed to Atlantic Central Airlines be made as previously, through physicians of
