Big Forest Fires To Remain Despite Improved Technique

OTTAWA (CP)—The really big forest fire will be around for a while yet, despite improved fire-fighting technology, United States forestry officials said here.

Dr. Keith Arnold of Washington, director of the forest protection division of the U.S. Forest Service, told a press conference it now can be seen that science and technology can eliminate major fires.

He set no timetable on when it would come about in North America.

Merle Lowden, fire control director of the U.S. Forest Service, said it may be a while. "There's going to be fewer big fires, but for some time there will be big fires," he said. When the right combination of

Paul Martin Praises Job In Cyprus

WINDSOR, Ont. (CP) — The great contribution to peace which the United Nations is making in Cyprus is probably the most effective operation the UN has ever conducted. External Affairs Minister Martin said here.

Speaking to the Canadian Federation of Mayors and Municipalities, Mr. Martin praised the "magnificent job" being done on the strife-torn island by the 6,000 "soldier-ambassadors" charged with peace-keeping duties.

FBI Director Claims Spies In Almost All Soviet Groups

WASHINGTON (AP) — FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover says spies are included in virtually every Soviet group that visits the United States — diplomats, correspondents, scientists, businessmen, students and cultural exchange missions.

"In regard to the Communist bloc espionage attack against this country, there has been no letup whatsoever," Hoover told a House of Representatives appropriations subcommittee.

"Our government is about to allow them to establish consulates in many parts of the country which, of course, will make our work more difficult," he added in testimony March 4, made public Monday night.

Asked whether he thinks advantages in cultural exchange will offset this disadvantage, the man who has headed the FBI for 41 years replied:

"We have found in practically every cultural exchange group

or student group that has come to this country, there is always a member of the KGB, the intelligence service of the Russian government. They are called students but some are 30, 37 or 38 years old."

Hoover went on:

"The numerous Soviet scientific delegations which arrive in the United States to tour U.S. universities and scientific establishments invariably have among their members Soviet scientists who have been given special assignments by the KGB. It is established Soviet policy that among such groups are one or more full-time KGB officers who are in charge of the delegations."

"Upon returning, Soviet scientists who have visited the United States under the exchange program are required by the KGB to submit comprehensive reports on the technical aspects of their trip, including descriptions of installations visited, research
