

U.S. Senators Back Speech By Kennedy

WASHINGTON (AP) — Several Democrats and Republicans in the U.S. Senate have praised a speech by Senator Robert Kennedy calling for moves aimed at halting the spread of nuclear weapons.

Senator John Pastore (Dem. R.I.) said "God bless you for making this speech" after the New York Democrat had finished.

"We are very close to the point of no return," said Pastore, who is a former chairman of the congressional committee on atomic energy. "The world will be destroyed by fire unless we in this generation do something about it."

"They tell me that the first surprise attack will kill 65,000-100 Americans," Pastore said.

"What difference does it make if we have to sit down and talk with Red China . . . about this problem?"

He said it was time someone whose name was known throughout the country and the world made such a speech as Kennedy had made Wednesday.

Senate Democratic Leader Mike Mansfield said it was a needed speech that took courage to make. While many will disagree with some of Kennedy's points, Mansfield said, he raised questions that have to be faced.

IDEA LESS ABHORRENT

"I'm afraid our own people are becoming too accustomed to the idea of nuclear war," Mansfield said.

Senator George Aiken (Rep. Vt.) said it was "a very profound speech that had to be made" and he was glad Kennedy "had the courage to make it."

At the White House, Press Secretary George Reedy said President Johnson already is searching for ways to halt the spread of nuclear weapons and has appointed a "task force" headed by Roswell Gilpatric to study it.

Senator Joseph Clark (Dem. Pa.) said: "There is practically unanimous support in this body (the Senate) for a turn toward peace and away from war."

He said he is convinced "our firm objective should be a detente with Russia so we can move forward together to maintain the peace of the world" in the face of a Chinese threat.

Hays Sees New Look Needed In Feed Grain Moving System

OTTAWA (CP) — Agriculture Minister Hays said here a new look is needed at the system of moving feed grains from west to east in Canada.

At a press conference, Mr. Hays declined to be drawn into details of what is wrong with present policy, but he said the existing system "has outlived its usefulness."

His comment followed an earlier suggestion by Forestry Minister Sauve for an eastern agency to handle the marketing of feed grains.

Mr. Hays said many people are unhappy with the present feed grain setup, both in Eastern and Western Canada. Mr. Hays said he has talked to Mr. Sauve about it.

Mr. Sauve's feed grain agency suggestion was accompanied by a claim that the Canadian Wheat Board with its monopolistic control of western feed grains controls the fate of eastern agriculture. The board controls the supply of feed grains to the east and prices.

Italian Youths Hail Beatles

MILAN (Reuters) — Thousands of teen-age rock 'n' roll fans gave Britain's mop-haired Beatles a frenzied welcome here when the quartet arrived here for their first Italian tour.

About 1,000 of the fans besieged the ticket office in the Central Railway Station, hours before the group's scheduled arrival and bought tickets to a neighboring station, to beat a police ruling restricting platforms to travellers only.

When the Beatles arrived, teen-agers thrived by a last minute switch of the arrival platform charged across the station concourse waving placards reading "God save the Beatles" and "Viva the Beatles."

This is the group's first visit to Italy—the land of Verdi and Puccini. They are scheduled to give two performances at a 26,000-seat outdoor stadium here.

Later, they go on to Genoa for two shows and then to Rome for four more.

DISMISS APPEAL

OTTAWA (CP) — The Supreme Court of Canada dismissed Thursday an appeal by a Winnipeg couple, Mr. and Mrs. Edward F. Radcliffe, who asked for damages of \$20,000.

Dr. John McBeath, claiming that in an operation he performed in 1959 on Mrs. Radcliffe the doctor had left a medical sponge in Mrs. Radcliffe's body.
