Hotel Loses With This Big Family

WASHINGTON (AP)—When the Wambach family of Harrisburg, Pa., takes a vacation on the weekend family plan, somebody just has to lose. This weekend it was the Statler Hotel here.

All summer most of Washington's large hotels have offered special bargain rates for families. The Statler, for instance, charges \$6 for each adult and puts the kids up free. That suited the

Wambachs perfectly — all 11 of them.

To house the Wambachs the Statler had to furnish them a four-room suite. The suite normally rents for \$74 a night. The Wambachs paid \$12.

That figures out to an average of \$1.09 a person for two adults and nine children. That's a bargain? Well, if the Wambachs had brought along their other two children the average would be only 92 cents.

One of the Wambachs' six girls suggested that "if we get all this for \$12, we ought to move."

Furthermore, they said they would urge their friends, including one family with 15 children, to patronize the Statler.

Assistant manager John Buck of the Statler just shuddered. Then he recovered enough to point out that the plan is good only on weekends, and only from July 1 to Labor Day.
