**Local and Other Items.**

**THE MISSION.**—The mission in St. Dunstan's Cathedral is being largely attended, the spacious church being well filled with women at each of the services. Confessions began this forenoon.

**A MONUMENT.**—The members of the St. John Division of the Ancient Order of Hibernians have decided to erect a monument in memory of the Irish victims of the cholera who were buried at Partridge Island in 1854.

**STRANGE INSURANCE CLAIM.**—A claim which is unique in the annals of fire insurance has just been paid to a Yarmouth man. **COLD STORAGE FOR P. E. I.**—Another advance has been made in the dairy industry of Prince Edward Island by the introduction of an Atlantic freight service with the best cold storage facilities. Eight years ago there was practically no dairy industry in that Province. The next year, cheese factories were established by the Dominion Government, and in two years, eleven stations, with 1,189 patrons, were in full working order. The development of the industry has been retarded by inefficient steamship service, and, now that this cause is being removed, further growth of both the cheese-making and butter-making industries will be a natural result.—Canadian Grocer.

## The Wonderful Cheap Men

**The Silk Cotton Tree.**  
 The most remarkable tree on the island of New Providence is without question a specimen of the silk cotton (Bombax ceiba) situated near the postoffice and prison. Growing from its trunk are half a dozen buttresslike extensions, as if to make a firm footing for its great spread of branches of 116 feet. A little boy to whom I showed a photograph of it expressed its appearance very well when he said the spaces between the buttresses would make fine horse stalls. The pods which grow on the tree contain a soft, silky material which the natives sometimes use for stuffing pillows. There are more of these trees, but none so large or old as this one, and we heard no estimate of its age. It is a near relative of the monkey tamarind. Between this bombax and the library is an avenue of Spanish laurel, a member of the fig family—untidy and inelegant trees, with a growth of roots hanging from their branches which never reach the ground. All these trees bear fruit, but the figs are small and unfit for eating.—E. G. Cummings in Popular Science Monthly.
