

Current Notes.

A woman is under sentence of thirty-five years' imprisonment for selling liquor at Rutland, Vt., that period being composed of 200 different terms for a like number of offences.

The length of the submarine cables in the whole world estimated to be 64,000 miles, and their value to be \$202,000,000. The length of all the wires in the world would reach 48 times around the earth.

Of the 123,000 square miles which Norway contains, only 3,500 are pasture and only 980 are under the plough. The consequence is that not only corn, but also butter and meat, have to be imported in large quantities.

The great horse farm at Trofrel, in the southern part of Normandy, covers 42,000 acres, and is the largest of its kind in the world. It belongs to Baron de Rothschild, who has pastured and stabled there as many as 1,200 head of thoroughbred horses at one time.

In Ireland last year there was an increase in the area under crops of 114,000 acres as compared with 1880. The greater part of this increase was in clover and meadow, but there was an increase of 10,000 acres in the area under cereals, and 23,000 acres in the area under green crops, chiefly in potatoes. As compared with 1872, there has been a decrease in area of about 300,000 acres, and this decrease has been going on ever since the potato famine. In spite of all assertions to the contrary, Ireland is a pastoral country. The whole area of the island is but little more than 20,000,000 acres, and last year more than 10,000,000 were under grass. Bog and waste covered four and three quarters million acres, and woods and plantations nearly 329,000 acres more. There remained, therefore, less than 5,200,000 acres under crops, and in this last area are included clover and meadow, which count for more than a third of the whole. The tillage, consequently, is not more than one third of the acreage of Ireland.

The following is a pretty good bear story told by the Chatam, N. B. World.—On Tuesday, evening last when Mr. George Trevors, who had been working in the Steamship Cuban then lying at Mr. Sargeant's mill wharf, Nelson, was done his day's work, he had occasion to go up to the store of Mr. Daniel Baldwin to purchase a few articles. It was then dark and when he started for his home in the Douglasfield he took the short cut across the woods. He had gone about a mile and a half when he was attacked by a very large bear. Being unarmed, and having no other weapon than a bottle of paraffin oil, he struck the bear and broke the bottle of oil over him. The bear then sprang on him and commenced hugging him, when George had the presence of mind to light a match and set fire to him. In an instant old bruin was all in a blaze and let go of him, and in less than five minutes he was all consumed but the head and shoulders. George then commenced to carry water in his hat to quench the fire to save the snout so as to get the bounty.

The march of progress seems to tell terribly on the teeth, for what other cause there can be for the pre-eminent and disastrous condition of young America, it is difficult to imagine. There are at present twelve large factories for the production of artificial teeth in the United States, turning out 10,000,000 teeth a year, while the consumption of gold used in stopping cavities in the natural teeth of America amounts in value to \$500,000, and is one of the chief facts that is alarming Mr. Ceruschi and the bimetalists, as it bears a very large proportion to the annual production of that metal. The present dearth of ivory may perhaps be traced to the American demand for molars and grinders, and the ships of Jonathan seem to be as busy in exporting gold and ivory from Europe as those of King Solomon were from Tarshish, though history, which only narrates the toothaches of princes, is silent as to whether this evil was prevalent among his subjects about that time. It is an ill wind, however, that blows nobody good, and the American dentist like the German oculist, flourishes on the physical failures of his countrymen.
