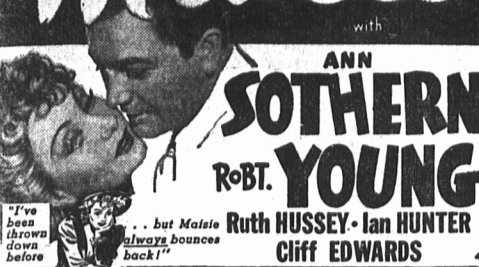

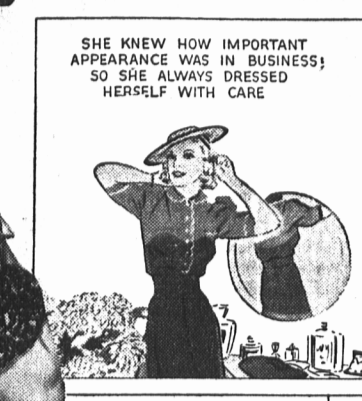

With the advent of sunny days and warmer weather most home heating plants have been shut off until next fall. Home-owners and householders are cautioned, however, that unless a certain amount of off-season care is taken there will be many repair bills when the heating system is started months hence.

Broken or warped grates should be repaired during the Summer months to prevent waste of fuel when the heating plant is again turned on in the Fall. Outer surfaces of the boiler should be cleaned, and the application of a preservative paint is effective in keeping the heating unit in good condition during the warm months.
