TORONTO (CP)—Late buying moved forward a notch on the stock exchange Friday, though the general tone of the market was irregular throughout.

Industrial trading showed a three-point range, showing few significant price changes. Selected copper were popular, gaining up to \$3, while western oils closed a little higher on the day.

Sales were at their lowest of the month with 9,401,000 shares traded.

Best industrial gain was 27.75 by Universal Products at \$61.25. Losses included \$2.75 by Crown Zellerbach, at \$67.50.

Opemiska featured the mining section with a \$3 jump to \$18.25. Quebec Lithium gained \$1.12 to \$13. Gaspe was up \$1 at \$48. Other leaders included Teganag, at \$7.15, and Rex Athabaska, up 27 at \$1.20.

Lake DuRoiil, Consolidated Tangeen, Wilroy and Quebec Copper were 10-15 cents lower.

Among western oils, Great Sweet Grass won back 70 cents of its \$1.80 plunge Thursday, closing at \$4.50.
