HARVEST EXHIBITION

This year's Provincial Harvest Exhibition, according to Bill Sterns, P. E. I. Department of Agriculture, promises to be an outstanding feature. Entries have been coming in from growers in many different parts of the Province. This show-window of Island horticultural products will be held in the Women's Institute Building at the Provincial Exhibition Grounds on Thursday, September 24th, and Friday, September 25th. There is no admission fee, all interested people are welcome.

To accommodate those who have been late with the harvest, the closing date for entries has been extended to Monday, September 21st. If you are planning to participate in the Harvest Exhibition, please get your entries in immediately to the P. E. I. Department of Agriculture, P.O. Box 2,000, Charlottetown. All exhibits must be in place by not later than 10 a.m. on Thursday 24th.

The vegetable class has been divided into two sections, one for market gardeners, and one section for the ordinary gardener.

This should prove to be a very popular feature; it gives you an opportunity to display the great diversity of vegetables grown in Island gardens.

The Island Fertilizer Company has announced a special prize of one-half ton of mixed fertilizer to go to the seed potato champion.

The E. D. Reid Produce Co. Ltd. is offering a special prize of \$5.00 for the best table turnips.

A special prize donated by the P. E. I. Frosted Food Limited, was announced by Mr. George Wright for growers of Broccoli, Brussels sprouts, and cauliflower. A deduction of \$5.00 off any seed order will be granted to the winners. According to Bill Sterns, a number of other prizes will probably be available at the time of the Exhibition.

Plans are being finalized for the ninth annual Rural Youth Fair Program which will be held on Thursday evening, September 24, 7:00 p.m., with the judging of the 4-H Club entries and Sports Program on Friday, September 25.

The program on Thursday, September 24 will consist of the King and Queen Contest, Public Speaking Competition, Entertainment from Clubs, 4-H Dress Review, the introduction of the National 4-H Club delegation and Recreation.

4-H ROYALTY

The 4-H King and Queen contest is open to all Prince Edward Island 4-H clubs — with a limit of one boy and one girl from each club.

The contestants will meet at Birch Court, Experimental Farm, on Thursday, September 24 at 2:00 p.m., where they will participate in preliminary competition. Contestants will be judged on appearance, personality, neatness of dress and a ability to speak in public, as well as a short oral interview on general knowledge and current events. At the close of this preliminary

Public Speaking Competition will consist of six speakers — the top placing contestant from the Junior and Senior divisions at the Club Rallies in Kings and Queens Counties, and from the Competition which will be conducted in Prince County.

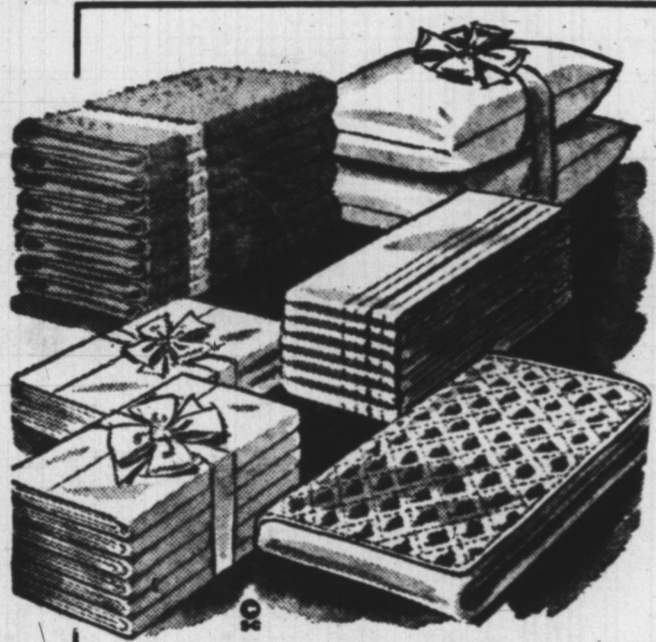

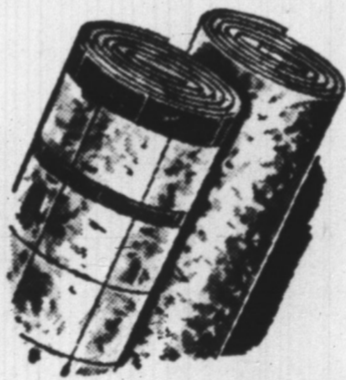

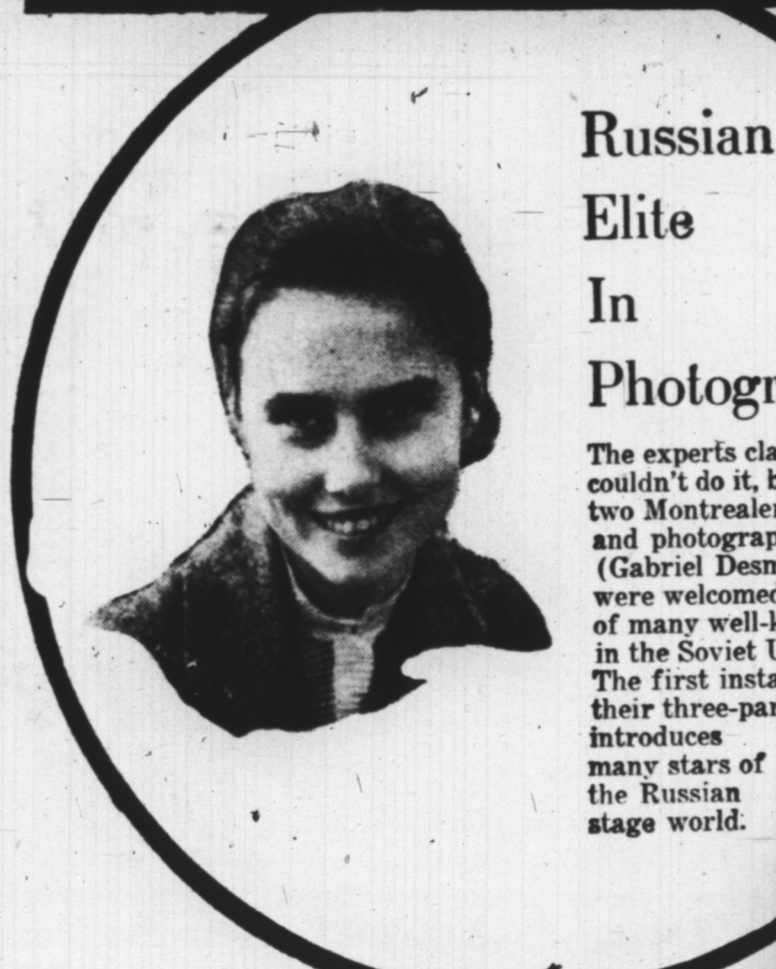
The Golden Years
