

Charged With Murder Of Stepfather At Orwell

Roger Clarence MacLean, 21-year-old resident of Orwell pleaded not guilty when arraigned on a charge of murder in Queens County Magistrate's Court yesterday. Magistrate Gilbert A. Gaudy remanded the hearing to Monday, August 11.

The charge arose following the death of the accused's stepfather, Walter Ross, 52, which occurred at his Orwell home Sunday, July 27th.

Investigating officers stated that the victim's body was found between 2:30 and 3:00 p.m. Reports circulated at the time indicated that the deceased appeared to have been badly beaten.

The charge against MacLean was laid before Magistrate Gaudy in Charlottetown July 28. The Magistrate's detachment of the R.C.M.P. are investigating the case.

MacLean is said to have returned to this Province about a month ago. He had been working in Ontario. Since his return he

had been working with farmers in the Orwell area and staying at the Ross home.

The late Mr. Ross served in Europe for three or four years with the Royal Canadian Engineers. Neighbours say he was an accomplished mechanic and carpenter and could turn his hand to almost anything.

He is survived by his wife, the former Mrs. Clarence (Edith) MacLean, and two children, Glen, nine, and Elaine, eight. The accused is one of five children born to Mrs. Ross by her previous marriage.

Prior to coming to Orwell 10 years ago, the late Mr. Ross had lived in Flat River.

Ordered on the day of death, an inquest on the Ross fatality will take place in Charlottetown next Monday evening before Coroner Dr. L.E. Prowse.

At yesterday's hearing the accused was represented by J.O.C. Campbell, Q.C.
