Will he make it?

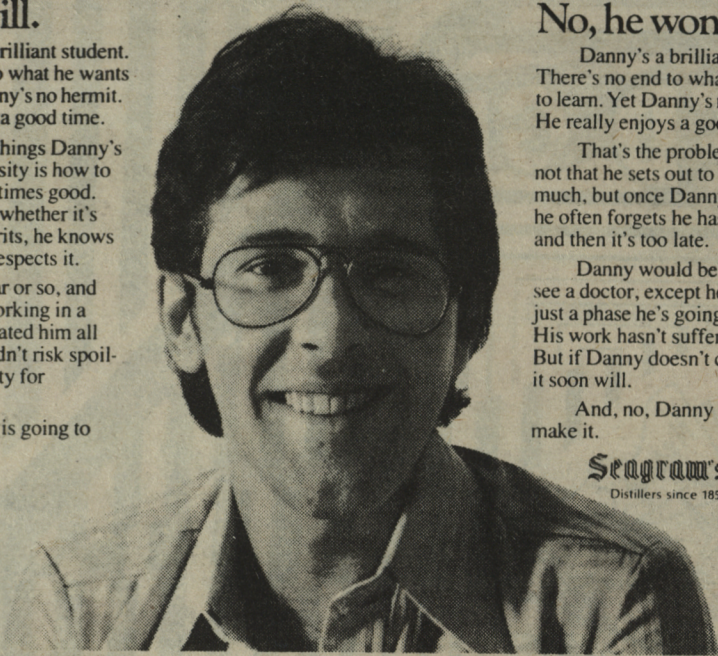
Yes, he will.
