

FRANK SULLIVAN HURLS SHUTOUT

Giants Win Marathon 6-5; Detroit Dumps Yanks 8-1

By THE ASSOCIATED PRESS. The New York Giants and Chicago Cubs battled 23 innings and set two major league records for players used Wednesday before the New Yorkers pulled out a 6-5 victory on Daryl Spencer's long sacrifice fly.

Freshman manager Bill Rigney sent 25 Giants into action, a record, and the Cubs used 23 for a total of 48, also a record. The Giants relied on eight pitchers, with rookie Joe Margoneri gaining while the Cubs used five hurlers. The loss was charged to the last, Jim Brosnan.

The Giants broke a tie which had existed since the eighth inning when Alvin Dark doubled, moved to third on a wild pitch, waited out intentional walks to Willie Mays and Dusty Rhodes, then dashed home on Spencer's fly ball.

FOUR HOME RUNS
Spencer had four hits during the game, including a two-run home run. Solly Drake, Gene Baker and Ernie Banks homered for Chicago.

Detroit dumped New York Yankees out of the American League lead with a three-hit, 8-1 job by Frank Lary and a 15-hit bombing by Johnny Kuckes, Rip Coleman and Mickey Vernon.

Mickey Mantle hit a home run, his sixth, and the only other New York hit was by Billy Martin and Yogi Berra.

The defeat dropped the Yanks 22 percentage points behind the Chicago White Sox, who were rained out of their afternoon game at Baltimore. However, on a won-and-lost basis, the Yanks actually were a game ahead of the White Sox.

SECOND THREE-HITTER
Frank Sullivan of the Boston Red Sox also came up with a three-hitter and went all the way for a shutout over Kansas City's Gus Zernial's singles with two out in the first inning and the ninth and Spook Jacobs' single off first baseman Mickey Vernon's glove in the fifth were the only hits by the Sox.

The three day games drew a total of only 11,532 fans. Cleveland's night game at Washington was rained out.

Two other night games were scheduled, Brooklyn at Cincinnati and Pittsburgh at St. Louis in the National, Philadelphia and Milwaukee were idle.

The Cincinnati Redlegs, who have used a home run hitting

binge to build up a six-game winning streak, cracked five more circuit blows in a night game to whip Brooklyn Dodgers 10-6.

Gus Bell got two of the homers, and Wally Post, George Crowe, and Ray Jablonski got one each. The Reds have now hit 16 homers in their last five games.

Dodgers belatedly got into the act themselves as Duke Snyder, Ray Campanella, and Sandy Amoros came up with four-baggers.

Marlies Defeat Regina Pats 4-2

TORONTO (CP)—Toronto Marlboros Wednesday night took a big step toward their second straight Memorial Cup championship by defeating Regina Pats 4-2 in the third game of the best-of-seven final. Marlboros now lead 2-0 in games with one tied.

Coach Murray Armstrong had no excuse for his club's 4-2 loss. "It was a good game and it could have gone either way," he said.

But he isn't conceding the title to the Toronto club.

"We aren't beaten yet," the Regina coach said. "I figure we'll come back and take Friday's game."

Coach Turk Broda of Marlboros said the next game would be played "our way—we'll do the bumping and not the chasing."

Says Joe Louis Demanded \$100,000 "Under The Table" To Defend Heavyweight Title

NEW YORK (AP)—The government Wednesday made public a Madison Square Garden office memorandum in which Joe Louis was alleged to have feared loss of his heavyweight title and demanded \$100,000 "under the table" to make a defence.

Louis never defended the title after his second fight with Jersey Joe Walcott, June 25, 1948, and retired March 1, 1949, when the International Boxing Club was formed. It was in connection with the formation of the IBC, which is on trial on charges of anti-trust violations, that the government produced the private document in questioning Truman Gibson, Louis' lawyer and now IBC secretary.

The memorandum, dated March 25, 1949, was from John Reed Kilpatrick, board chairman of the Garden, to Ned Irish, Garden executive vice-president, relating to a discussion between Kilpatrick and Sol Strauss, lawyer for the late Mike Jacobs. The memorandum dealt with a meeting in Miami at Jacobs' home in the latter part of 1948 or early 1949 attended by Jacobs, Louis, Marshall Miles, then Louis' manager, and Gibson.

It read in part:

"He (Strauss) said that in his negotiations with Joe Louis in December (1948) for a summer fight, Joe had insisted that he get \$100,000 in addition to his percentage which he felt should be increased over the 4 per cent of his contract. Sol (Strauss) said that he pointed out the impossibility of doing this but Joe was adamant and that he went to see Mike (Jacobs) in Miami with Truman Gibson and Marshall Miles. Sol said that they left Mike alone with Joe and in a few minutes Mike came out very upset. Sol said that Joe told Mike that the \$100,000 would have to be tax free, in other words, under-the-table, and the meeting broke up."

"Sol said that Joe had a terrific fear of being beaten and had asked Sol what he could expect if he were beaten. Sol said that in that event he would put Joe on the 20th Century (Jacobs' boxing club) payroll for \$25,000 a year."

PATTERSON RANKED FIFTH

Moore Top Heavyweight

NEW YORK (AP)— Archie Moore, the light heavyweight champion, is listed as the No. 1 heavyweight in the world, now that Rocky Marciano has retired, in the latest monthly ratings by Ring magazine.

Floyd Patterson, previously ranked as Moore's top challenger in the 175-pound division, moves up to become the No. 5 heavy in the scrambled division.

Nat Fleischer, Ring editor, said he moved up Patterson because his manager, Gus D'Amato already had claimed the heavyweight title and also because a match was imminent between Patterson and Tommy (Hurricane) Jackson—the No. 2 heavy. The Patterson-Jackson match hasn't been signed but there are signs it will be staged in Madison Square Garden in June.

Bob Baker, the hulking Pittsburgh contender who lost a disputed decision to Jackson during

The new No. 1 challenger in the light heavyweight class is Gerhardt Hecht of Germany, followed by Yolande Pompey of Trinidad who meets Moore for the title in London, June 5.

Gene Fullmer's victory over Ralph (Tiger) Jones and Charley Joseph's decision over Milo Savage changed the middleweight rankings. Fullmer of West Jordan, Utah moved up to third and Savage who had been second dropped to fifth.

The top middleweights behind champion Ray Robinson are Bobo Olson, Charles Humes of France, Fullmer and Bobby Boyd of Chicago in that order.

Top Marksmen In Can. Skeet Ch'ships At Montreal Friday

MONTREAL (CP)—Top marksmen from Canada and the United States shoulder guns here Friday in the first Canadian skeet championship.

The new event, to be held at the Montreal skeet club, will be run off in connection with the 1956 Quebec championships. The meet will wind up Sunday.

Barney Hartman of Ottawa, 1955 Quebec open champion, is considered a top threat for the new crown. Hartman has a run of 717 consecutive birds going and is aiming for the world record of 1,021, held by Charles E. Boardman of Philadelphia. He will be within 60 of the mark if he goes through the weekend meet without a miss.
