All-Stars Clash

BASEBALL'S TWO dream teams take to the field next Tuesday in the staging of the 35th annual major league All-Star game. The contest will be played at New York's Shea Stadium, in aid of the baseball pension plan fund. The American League manager, the big catch, Al Lopez, will be out to protect a very slight series edge; an edge that is so slight in fact that with one more loss the A.L. won't be over the edge. The American edge is 17-14-1 over the Nats.

The Nationals will probably be the favorites Tuesday. Since 1959 the Americans have won two and the Nationals six, with one tie.

Both the American and National Leagues have announced dominantly right handed hitting starting lineups so the guess is that Lopez and National manager, Walt Alston will start right-handers and not lefties Wilford Ford and Sandy Koufax as one might expect.

Indications are that Alston will go with 'perfect game' Jim Bunning of Philadelphia Phillies and Lopez may start Minnesota Twins' Gennaro Pascual.

In selecting his team for Tuesday, Lopez seems to be favoring the high average hitter over the power hitter. For example, he selected the more modestly hitting Leseppe so the guess is that Lopez and National manager, Walt Alston will start right-handers and not lefties Wilford Ford and Sandy Koufax as one might expect.

Kidd Inconsistent

CANADA'S TEEN-AGED sensation of a few years back, Bruce Kidd, could not keep his reputation as "one of the 90's." At least that's the impression one gets when you consider the performances he has turned in lately.

Kidd's 100 metre run at Toronto's Invitational meet with comparative ease over Dublin's Tom O'Riordan. His time was 14:07.8, 25 seconds slower than his best time of 1:18.4 set at the Canada record. He was weak ago however, Kidd was beaten badly by the same country's best runner in Montreal's St. Jean meet. He finished a poor third.

This has been the history of Kidd's track performances in recent months. It has been recognized as "one of the best of the world's best" by some persons who seem to get a kick out of blowing up the reputation of Canada's athletes.

Kidd has admitted that his performance in some of the best young runners in the world has affected his performances. He said he has had a "mental block" responsible for his poor performance. Consistent with something that probably only comes to Kidd if he can regain self-confidence.

Kidd's coach Fred Foote, East York Track and Field Club, has been criticized for not seeing Kidd as a star when he was younger. Foote and many other critics however, insist that Kidd was a "slight work" who was a "slight work" for a while because he was everything in sports but what is the future for Kidd?

There are a number of meets before Tokyo this fall, but that won't be the proving grounds for Kidd. His big test should come in the 1968 Olympics.
