More Building Permits Issued

OTTAWA (CP)—Value of building permits issued by Canadian municipalities in September rose 2.8 per cent to \$155,251,000 from \$150,970,000 in September of month last year, according to statistics today.

Permit values were higher than last year in Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Ontario, Manitoba and Saskatchewan. Provincial totals, with last year's figures in brackets:

Newfoundland, \$383,000 (\$20,000); Prince Edward Island, \$69,000 (\$91,000); Nova Scotia, \$1,941,000 (\$1,307,000); New Brunswick, \$1,824,000 (\$1,789,000); Quebec, \$29,378,000 (\$31,499,000).
