Bank Of Montreal Marks 50th Anniversary Here

Charlottetown industry of 50 years ago was of little importance. Transportation also was in contrast to what we know today: in place of today's frequent air and ferry services, there was only a narrow gauge railway from Charlottetown to Summerside, and a slow steamer, from Summerside to Point Stu. **STEADY PROGRESS**

From Mr. Peter's original staff of four has grown the present B of M staff of 22. Following Mr. Peter's as manager, in 1905, was E. G. Coombs. After 18 years here, Mr. Coombs was succeeded by George Filmer, who was manager until 1921. S. R. Finlayson served for two years after Mr. Filmer and, in 1923, Arthur I. B. Belcher took charge of the branch. He remained here for 13 years until 1946, when he handed over the post to Norman L. Ford. Mr. Ford was manager for two years.

In 1948, Fletcher W. Troop became manager and remained until three years later when Ron E. Rogers, the present manager, took over.

In addition to being a past president of the Charlottetown Board of Trade, a director of the Y. M. C. A. and a member of the advisory board of the Salvation Army, he is a member of the Rotary Club, the Charlottetown Club and the Charlottetown Golf Club.

PIONEER BANKING

The forward-looking spirit of the local B of M stems from the earliest traditions of the parent bank, which was founded in 1817. Within a fortnight of its establishment, Canada's first bank introduced the branch-banking system. This flexible and trustworthy type of organization has long since proven a mainstay of the nation's relative stability in economic affairs. In its first year, the bank also issued Can-

ada's earliest native currency and became the colonial government's permanent provision for the building and, at the added price, it was completely re-decorated and refurbished.
