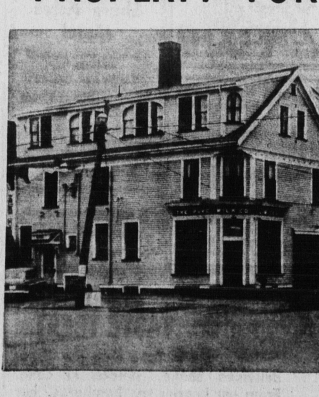

Haida Purchased, Will Be Museum

TORONTO (CP)—One of the navy's most famous warships, the HMCS Haida, has been purchased by a Toronto businessman for \$200,000 and will be berthed here as a naval museum.

The 2,000-ton destroyer is due to arrive in Toronto harbor late next month. It is to be delivered to the city on August 14 at Sorel, Que., and will be towed to Toronto.

Harry McWeaver, retired vice-admiral and one of Haida's former commanding officers, is dealing with the navy to ensure that the ship arrives here with as much Second World War equipment as possible.

After arrival, the ship will be restored to its wartime fighting appearance. The British-built Haida became part of the RCN in 1943. She served on the Marmora equipment runs, then with a mixed Canadian-British destroyer flotilla in the English Channel.

Haida was in on the kills of four German destroyers and became a legendary terror to German E-boat skippers. In April 1945, she picked up Haida was with HMCS Athabaskan when that ship was sunk by a submarine off the coast of Newfoundland.

Haida sank one of the German ships and damaged another, then risked torpedoes to pick up survivors and left her sector both before and after the war. The sea boat evaded German craft and made it alone back to England.

Haida also made two tours of duty in the Korean War. The RCN retired her from service last fall and declared her surplus early this year. Bruce MacCrimmon, commercial pilot who has no naval interest, has a summer appearance headed the campaign to save the ship from the scrap heap.

Since then he has travelled thousands of miles, attended meetings and run up telephone bills "like the national debt" to achieve the ship's preservation.

Pakistan, China Route To Reopen

Pakistan and China, the Hunza-Sinkiang route which was closed in November, 1959, is to be reopened in 1965, it was reported in the "Straits Times".

Two other developments give rise to the possibility of the reopening of the route. Groundwork has been completed for the opening of the Pakistan-China border. The Indus Valley road, the first all-weather road in the region, will be completed by the end of the year.

With a road already in existence between Gilgit and Hunza, the reopening of the Indus Valley road will provide a land route from China into the heart of Pakistan.

This in turn will sharply increase opportunities for commercial and cultural intercourse between the two nations.

Relations between the two nations cooled, however, largely because of Pakistan's objection to Chinese troops in Tibet which Peking claimed were an internal matter.

In October, 1959, Chinese incursions were taking place in the Karakoram and Ladakh. China's border with Pakistan and Pakistan had not been demarcated. The Pakistani press of occasional pressure of Chinese troops on the "Pakistan" territory as well.

Pakistan therefore tightened its border, closing off all diplomatic relations in China.

In March, 1962, however, Peking and China reached a rather equitable border agreement and since April this year four Chinese in Pakistan have been demarcating the border with pillars. Pakistan has 300 miles along the Karakoram mountains.

With relations rapidly improving, the two countries have recently signed a trade agreement. China has suddenly emerged as the biggest buyer of Pakistani wool. It has bought more than 200,000 bales up to March.

SPECIAL SIGNIFICANCE Completion of the Indus Valley road will thus have special significance. Previously the link between West Pakistan and Gilgit-Hunza was either by air over an arduous 13,800-foot-high mountain track through the Karakoram Pass.
