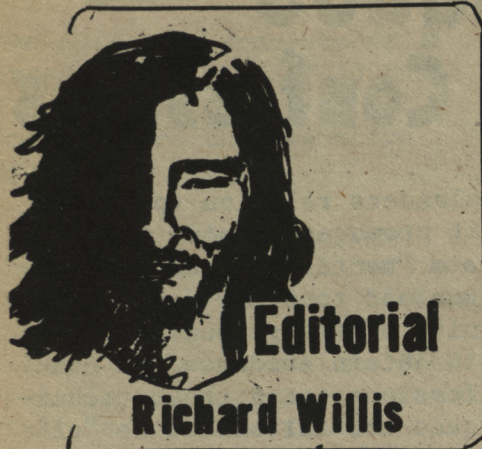


Eulogy For Dave McCurdy - Our ARCUP Representative
