Kiggins was reappointed as a director and with Mr. Earl Walsh, (President), Mr. Archie Wight (Vice-President), Mr. Patrick Murphy and Mr. Marcellus Goelet make up the Board of Directors. Mr. William Murphy was appointed to the supervisory committee to fill the vacancy caused by the death of the late P.L. Boudreau. Other members of the supervisory committee are, F. J. Delany and L.S. In his address the President, Mr. Earl Walsh referred to the loss the Credit Union movement in Georgetown suffered in the
