MONTREAL (CP) — The U.S. dollar closed Thursday at a discount of 2 1/2 per cent in terms of Canadian funds, down 3-32. Pound sterling \$2.71 15-16, down 1-16.

Toronto Stocks

TORONTO (CP) — The stock market lost its steam in late trading Thursday, closing mixed to slightly lower after stubbornly holding a moderate gain for most of the session.

A mild spurt of selling finally overtook the market in the last 15 minutes to turn the day's gain into losses or unchanged prices from the previous session.

Base metals were the hardest hit by the last-minute developments as their index fell more than a point near the close.

Western oils managed to win almost a point on their index, although they were ahead 1 1/2 points earlier.

Noranda lost 1 1/2 points and Hudson Bay a point to lead senior base metals lower. Other issues declined fractionally.

Coppers were easier with Gaspe off a point and Temagami down 25 cents. Juniors were mostly mixed.

Consolidated West Pats showed one of the better western oils gains, a climb of 50 cents. North Canadian, Northern, Triad, Security and Calgary advanced.

Other winners: Peace River lost 5 cents and National Pete and Canadian Devonian 15 cents.

Index changes: golds up .35 to 72.48; base metals off 1.15 to 22.48; western oils off .91 to 157.49.

Scattered sales on these kinds were 50 cents to \$1 a hundredweight lower. Cows and bulls were steady.

Macmillan is also expected to discuss the economic implications of the Suez Canal crisis with officials of the United States treasury.

NEW YORK (AP) — A late sell-off knocked the props from a slightly higher stock market Thursday and chalked up another decline.

Prices of leading issues slipped from fractions to about two points. A scattering of specialties made gains.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was down 70 cents to \$175.80.

The background of business and economic news was mixed early in the day. There was a rise in rail carloadings and auto output but layoffs were reported in the appliance field and inventory problems among farm equipment makers.
