



DOWN THE BACK STRETCH

We're delighted to have a letter from Willard Macdonald of Summerside who is at present spending a holiday at Daytona Beach, Florida. Willard writes:— "I hear you are having lots of snow at home. We have been here for three weeks enjoying temperatures up to 83 degrees. Last Friday I went over to Winter Park and saw Mr. and Mrs. William Hood. He has three in training, a 2-year-old filly by High Volo, Honey's Peter Patch 3, 2.06 4-5 and Victory Mac 2.04 3-5. We had a great talk about old times and Billy's wonderful campaigns with Watchim 2.06. Then we talked to the trainer and driver of Bay State Pat 2.01 4-5 and saw Jim working in 2.10 last half in 1.02, also Wayne MacPherson in the same stable that worked a mile in 2.11, last half in 1.01.

"We went over to Orlando and met Clint Hodgins, the Canadian driver, who has thirteen in training. Clint is quite a guy. Enclosed you will find a directory from Ben White Raceway showing all the horses with their trainers that are making use of the three tracks there. They are planning their first matinee the afternoon of the second of March. We intend to go farther south in a week or so and see most tracks on our way home. We especially want to see Earle Avery at Pinehurst, also Jack Richardson, who was with Joe O'Brien for several years and started on his own last year. We hope to have a chance to see him at Stanley Dancer. Have taken some nice

pictures of the horses at the various tracks. . . . This is the place for you." Thanks, Willard.

LEADING SIRE
From Jim Harrison, Publicity Director of the USTA, we have particulars of the ten leading sires in the United States and the money won by their get. . . . Sons and Daughters of Adios won in excess of \$1,000,000 in 1956, the first time in history that the get of a harness racing stallion exceeded that figure in a single season. The U. S. Trotting Association announced.

Adios is owned by a syndicate made up of three Pennsylvania nurseries, Meadowlands Farm at Meadow Lands; Hanover Shore Farms, Hanover; and Hempstead Farm, Mechanicsburg. The stallion, who changed hands for a record \$500,000 two years ago, stands at Meadowlands. Adios sent 141 trotters and pacers, predominantly the latter, to the races in 1956 and they won 473 dashes, three less than Castleton, Farrar, King's Counsel who led the nation in that category. Adios also established a new record for money winnings by two and 3-year-olds with 72 of his get banking \$506,443. They won 204 races, likewise a new national standard.

Each of the five leading sires on the money earnings list flies the Hanover Shoe Farms banner. The other four stand for service at Hanover itself and in order of rank are Knight Dream (\$383,190), Titan Hanover (\$514,169), Hoot Mon (\$511,477) and Nibble Hanover (\$494,500). Back to the long, long ago . . . We picked up a summary a few days ago of the races held at the Charlotte track Exhibition Week, October 7-9, 1891, and we are sure that there are many besides ourselves who will remember having seen these events. . . . Three Minutes, Class Trotting, Harry Al Right, 1-1-1, 1-1-1, Parnell, 2-2-4; Fair Ellen, 5-5-2, Time, 2:42, 2:40½, 2:45¼. Harry Al Right was owned by A. L. Gillis and Fair Ellen by K. A. MacNeill, Summerside. Futurly Stakes, foals of 1889. Brazilian, E. C. Mahon, 1-1-1, Lute S, 2-3, Chief Lock, J. A. MacNeill, 2-2, Time, 2:56½, 3:01. Lute S, was owned by the Hon. George E. Hughes, proprietor of Apothecaries Hall. Free for All Trot—Minnie Gray, owned by W. Gammon, 1-1-1, Lady Pilot, E. H. MacMillan, 2-2, Blackie, E. C. Camerun, 4-4-3, Luck Derrick, Newt Lee, 2-3-dis, Time, 2:30½, 2:30, 2:30.

October 9, Three Year Old Trotting—Parkside, W. A. Brennan, Summerside, 1-1-1, Dot, G. M. Read, Tryon, 2-2-2, Almont Wilkes, H. Craswell, 3-3-3, Time, 2:40½, 2:38, 2:34. Parkside was bought as a 2-year-old from Senator Leland Stanford, Palo Alto, Calif., and brought here by Jimmie Houghton, W. A. Brennan, Summerside and proved a most valuable sire, his blood running through many of the best trotters and pacers raised in this province. Stallions trotting Class—Elmo owned by Dr. C. Strickland, 2-1-1-1, Israel, owned by A. C. Bell, 1-2-3-2, Gold, owned by A. N. Large, 3-3-2-3, Time, 2:31½, 2:33¾, 2:36, 2:33, 2:40 Class Trot—Lady Pilot, E. H. MacMillan, 1-1-1, Sea King, A. L. Lipp, 2-2-2, Harry C. H. C. Conally, 3-dis, two others distanced, Time, 2:35, 2:30½, 2:37.

Our readers must remember the tracks were very heavy in those days and the sulkies were the high-wheeled types made over in bike sulkies by the addition of bicycle wheels. Horses were also hauled much more heavily than at the present of the public was quite as great as it is today and one had to be very careful that he said about a neighbor's horse.

A new season's mark for 2-year-old pacers was set up at Orlando, Florida, recently when Johnny Simpson drove Alton a hundred yards in 2.29 with the final quarter in 22 seconds. The performance was made over the half mile track and Adios Paul was the first colt or filly to beat 2.30 this year. Tom Farlock, who drove Thomas B. Scot, p. 1.58 2-3 in all his races and 2-year-old trotters and pacers have been beating 3.00 over various Florida tracks and the trainers are commencing to step up their aged horses a bit after giving them a lot of jogging and slow work. From whom you can read about the various tracks we can confidently predict that more 2-year-old trotters and pacers will take records this season than ever before.

A moving multiple barrier has been perfected by trainer-driver Ed Brown of Sydney, Australia. Races in Australia and New Zealand start from a standing start and are handicapped and the multiple barrier is adapted for that type of racing. Races are at one and one-quarter miles minimum and the usual races being one and one-half miles or longer. The excitement is enhanced as the back starters make up their distance handicaps and come up to challenge the front horses near the finish. The multiple barrier can operate from any number of positions and can be speeded up to forty miles per hour.

At the meeting of District 11, USTA held in Mancton recently, a motion was passed appointing

saliva and urine tests at a few time tracks for the purpose of detecting stimulants if they are used. The belief that stimulation horses is common is not shown by the reports of harness racing commissions in the United States. For instance the New York Harness Racing Commission report for the year 1956, 2,063 samples of urine and saliva were submitted to the laboratory for analysis. This showed a 7 percent increase of saliva and 33 percent increase of urine samples over those taken in 1955. Only two positive samples were returned from the laboratory.

After extensive investigation it was ascertained that in one instance the positive reaction was the result of a horse receiving "caffein" in a soft drink accidentally spilled on the hand of a groom shortly before the post parade, and in the second positive sample which has been part of a penicillin injection administered to the animal prior to 48 hours before the race, hence not in violation of the rules and regulations of the commission. The commission also noted that 149 penalties were imposed against drivers during the 1956 season, an increase of 27 percent over the 1955 figure of 117. Following a three-year study the commission has made the installation of photo patrols at all tracks where harness racing is conducted a consideration or the issuance of track licenses for the 1957 harness racing season.

NEW ARRIVAL
We notice that there were five new arrivals at the Camp Farm, Shafter, Calif., up to February 7th. They are: brown colt by Meadow Face 3, 1:59 3-5, dam, Jessica Scott 2:06½, bay colt by Scott Frost 1:58 1-5, dam, Rilda Mite 3, 2:03, brown colt by Mighty Sun 2:00, dam, Vixen 2:05-5 brown colt by Scott Frost, dam, Dianna Star 4, 2:04. She is the dam of Diana Streak 1:58 4-5 and Dazzle Mite 3, 2:03. The other mares are all producers and shows how intelligently Sol Camp and Joe O'Brien have gone about their breeding operations.

The trotting stallion Watchim 2:05, holder of track records on several Mainland oval tracks, but two trotters in the 2:05 list in 1956. Watchim while in service in the U.S.A. was only bred to a limited number of mares but has produced a lot of record horses from them. In the years to come we should see quite a number of his get performing over Maritime tracks and we hope that some of them will erase the records of their famous sire.

In the latest Horseman and Fair World are pictures of members of the Sol Camp stable being trained over the new farm track. Adios progresses 2, 2:01 with Jean Mattei up. Lyola Hanover with Joe O'Brien up, Diamond Hal 1:57 2-5 with Don Larlee up and Scott Frost 1:58 3-5 with Joe O'Brien driving. We are glad to note that Joe O'Brien can handle the ribbons as well. His Scott Frost and several others are entered in large stakes that will be raced in California within a few weeks.
