Opening lead—four of spades.

The problem of when to cover an honor with an honor does not lend itself to any flat rule. The defender adjusts his play to the particular circumstances with which he is faced. When there is something to be gained by covering an honor with an honor, the defender covers. Otherwise, he does not.

Examine the club situation in this deal. East wins the spade lead and returns a spade to the ace. Declarer leads the ten of clubs. Should East cover with the king?

Yes. Observe first the effect if East plays the seven on the ten.
