A Libel Suit.

The slander suit brought by Dr. Weldon, M. P. for Albert county, versus John T. Hawke, editor of the Moncton Transcript, is set down for trial at the session of the Circuit Court which opened at Dorchester yesterday. The ground for the suit is contained in two articles published in the Transcript in September last, in which it is stated among other things that Dr. Weldon wrongfully collected twenty-seven dollars mileage as a member of Parliament by giving Halifax as his place of residence instead of Elgin, Albert county, and that he is, therefore, a bootler and should be placed on the list with McGreevy and others.

Without reference to this case we may say that on general principles the Times does not believe in libel suits unless under extreme provocation. Public men should ordinarily stand or fall by their public record and the reckless denunciation or abuse of a newspaper has no injurious effect in the end.

DORCHESTER, July 20. - Dr. Weldon's evidence was that he had his family residence in Halifax at the time parliament met and that he started from Halifax for Ottawa and returned to Halifax at the close of session. He swore that he had for years regularly received annual passes from the C. P. R., and other roads, but usually traveled by the Intercolonial, which gave no passes, and always paid his fare whichever road he traveled at cost of over a hundred dollars a year.
