N. Y. Stock Market Hits New High In Current Boom

(By William D. Horgan)

NEW YORK, April 9—(AP)—The stock market, advancing Saturday for the sixth time in a row, hit a high for the current bull move. Last week's rise added more than \$1,500,000,000 to the market value of all stocks listed on the exchange. Not since October 1948 has the market advanced so much in a single week. The performance was the more impressive in view of the Good Friday recess.

At the close Saturday the Associated Press average of 60 stocks stood at 76.1, a peak since August 1946—and not too far away from a 20-year high.

Saturday's market was typical of many recent sessions. Instead of the market rising over a broad front, buyers focussed their attention on specific groups. Chemicals, motors and aircraft were favored.

Chrysler jumped 1-1/8 to 68-5/8, a 1948-50 high and a gain of four points on the week. Buying was inspired largely by fresh hopes that the United Automobile Workers (C.I.O.) and the auto makers would get together and settle a strike under way since late January.

Among Canadian issues, metals were weak. McIntyre was down 1-2 and Dome Mines off 1-8. Gains of 1-8 each were shown by Canadian Pacific and Distillers Seagrams. Hiram Walker was unchanged.

The AP 60-stock average inched up .1 of a point to 76.1, with the utility group unchanged and industrials and rails a trifle ahead.

The 1948-50 bull market is close to winding up its ninth month. The rise started back in mid-June when the price line curved up after cracking to a 4 1/2-year low.

Meat production in this country totalled 2,131,000,000 pounds last year, down five per cent from the 1948 total of 2,235,000,000 pounds.

Due mainly to reduced United Kingdom purchases of Canadian bacon, exports of Canadian meat on a cold dressed carcass basis fell to 205,669,000 pounds last year from 418,313,000 the year before, but still above the 1935-39 average of 193,436,000 pounds.

CLEVELAND, April 9—(AP)—Steel Magazine today forecast a levelling-off in demand during the last half of 1950.

The prediction came in the midst of a "tightening supply and booming demand, reminiscent of the immediate post-war position."

Steel stated that "conversion deals are increasing and gray market offerings are more numerous at some points. Rigid distribution controls are being applied, even on such products as bars, plates and shapes."

The United States steel-making rate rose a half point last week to 97.5 per cent of capacity. "This is equivalent to more than 1,850,000 tons, largest weekly tonnage in a year," Steel said.
